## Membership










## A Wildlife Oasis in the City

# The Park is Beautiful! And Just How Exactly Are We Paying for It...

While the most common comment I hear about our new park is how fantastic it turned out, the next question always seems to be a question of money.

Our new park cost almost \$3 million, our largest investment to date in club facilities. It has been planned for years but it is worth taking a few minutes to understand the club's financial situation and how we plan to pay for this and other capital improvements in the coming years.

When we began construction, we had \$1 million in cash reserves and took out a term loan for \$2 million to pay for the remainder of the park over 10 years. With our annual payment of approximately \$250,000, this is well within our annual capital budget estimated at \$500,000.

Where does the capital budget come from? Unlike in years past, we now use our annual dues to pay for operating expenses, and our initiation fees from new members are used to fund capital improvements. For the 2019 fiscal year, we collected over \$600,000 in initiation fees. The initiation fees will change year over year based on A and C member turnover, but we expect the range to be within \$425,000 - \$550,000 annually.

While the interest rate is quite favorable, it still seemed inefficient to pay monthly interest charges while maintaining a significant cash balance in our checking account. Last month, with the Board's approval, we converted that term loan into a Line of Credit. This Line of Credit allows us to use our current available cash to pay down the balance immediately; and draw on it as necessary to fund operating expenses. This approach will save us \$60,000 in interest charges in the first three years alone!

As of today, we have approximately \$300,000 in the checking account, the Line of Credit has a balance of \$800,000, and we are saving interest charges on approximately \$1.2 million versus the term loan arrangement. We will continue to manage this closely and expect that our balance on this Line of Credit will be close to zero within two years.

We have also started a Capital Reserve Study for the Club. This study will evaluate the Club's assets and expected repairs and improvements for the years to come. It will help the Board make decisions regarding future improvements and be sure that we are preparing for the inevitable repair and replacement costs that come with operating a facility intensive club like ours.

On behalf of the Board, I would like to thank you for your interest and questions regarding the financial health of the Club. We all recognize that the Brookwood Hills Community Club is a special place and we will continue to do our best to be good stewards of your money.

## Dear BWHCC Members and BWH Neighbors,

I'd like to provide a mid-year update on BWHCC accomplishments and what's coming in the next few years.

Members and neighbors have been asking for more services and amenities but not at a cost of losing what makes Brookwood Hills special as a club and neighborhood. Despite a significant increase in BWHCC initiation fees, we still see continued demand for membership. In addition to first class swim and dive teams, the park and social events are big attractions for families. Our membership levels remain at historical averages, but our revenues continue to rise from the higher initiation fees.

The park renovation is complete and up to BWH standards aesthetically and functionally. This was a multi-year project that required a large amount of volunteer resources, time and effort. The results of the project are visible, but more importantly, the use by all demographics of our membership has been positive. With differing common areas, we can now use the space for various events. Of course, we have a long list of park requests from members, which we are prioritizing and tackling one by one.

Late last year, the board agreed to implement a change in membership management software to help improve new member on-boarding, communications, and financial record-keeping. This was a big project and thanks to a small group of volunteers, the execution went well. This software project was especially difficult due to the poor quality of our membership data. The new technology is a significant upgrade, as it allows the club to track our finances more accurately than in years past. Starting now, we will use initiation fees to fund capital expenditures, and annual dues will be designated for operating expenses. In the past, the club was unable to track different revenue or expense sources which limited long-term planning and the ability to accurately price annual dues. This change means that dues should cover operating expenses. Conversely, initiation fees will pay for replacement of club assets. Our goal by year end is to formalize a replacement schedule for every club asset and then start a process of building a reserve fund for the future replacement of each asset.

Two constant areas important to all of us are security and managing the development surrounding BWH. As for security, the price of license plate reading (LPR) cameras has dropped substantially; the board approved the installation of LPR cameras at our entrances. It is long overdue to install video cameras at the pool pavilion, tennis courts and new park. Both security camera projects are scheduled to be completed before the holidays, and as a former Security Chair, the install can't get here soon enough.

Members continue to ask for more amenities and we've responded with an expanded social calendar and improved member communications. We extended the pool hours an additional three weeks of September. The new member party, one of my favorites, is scheduled for 9/27, which is followed quickly by Halloween festivities. One change the board recognized and will implement for 2020 is a new role of "Activity Chair." Member demand for pavilion and park facilities grows and we feel we can manage our resources better.

Consistent with a theme of member value, we implemented an annual survey for swim and dive team this year. The results from members of both programs were very positive, as expected. The survey suggestions will provide feedback on how we can improve our program with just a few small changes.

If you feel left out from answering a survey, don't worry. A larger membership survey is under development, which will be emailed soon enough. With the park project behind us, your ideas will help the board formulate a longer-term club strategy.

As always, we welcome collaboration across the club and appreciate the efforts of each and every person who has volunteered their time to make all of the above efforts a reality.
