

Michael Gilman, son of Lorraine and Murray Gilman, competed in the National Skill Level Squash Tournament held in Atlanta April 3rd-5th. The strucutre of competitive squash is similar to ALTA. There are eight different skill levels ranging from 3.0 to 6.5, with the top pros in the world competing at the 6.5 level. Michael competed at the 3.5 level against a field of adult men and made it to the finals. In addition to his outstanding performance at this tournament, Michael was ranked nationally in March in the National Junior competition for the 14 years and under level. His interest in squash began by tagging along with dad to Sportslife Squash Annex on Windy Hill Rd. Now squash is Michael's passion, even to the exclusion this year of All Star Buckhead Baseball. What surprises mother Lorraine

the most is that Murray is playing with adult men and winning. When he's not playing squash, Michael is a 7th grader at Woodward Academy. The Withers have been in the neighborhood for 15 years and have an older son, Adam, and a daughter, Margot.

# BWH RUNNER GOES THE DISTANCE

Kate Irvin, daughter of Jan and Mac Irvin, competed in the NCAA National Competition in Track and Field in Boston, placing as the top freshman in the country for Division III. Kate runs the 1500 meter and other distance events. To qualify for the national competition, Kate won the indoor track competition in the 1500 meter for the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) with a time of 4:41. A local paper described Kate's performance in glowing term: "Running an extremely smart and strategic race resulted in a time of 4:41 for Irvin...Not only did Irvin run one of the fastest times in Middlebury history, she also qualified for the NCAA championships..."

Kate graduated in 1997 from Westminster and is a freshman at Middlebury College in Vermont. She is currently running three seasons, and her cross country team finished third in the nation among Division III schools and was named Academic All-Amercian team. In addition to running, Kate is currently majoring in French.

# Barry Miller Sr. Retires





Barry is something of an institution in Brookwood Hills. His reports at the annual meeting have been described as "The Barry Miller Show" (see article entitled *Two Barry's are Even Better than One* in the August 1995 issue of Brooknotes). For many Community Club members, those reports are the highlight of the meeting.

But Barry has always taken his job in the neighborhood very seriously. During his first night of security patrol in Brookwood Hills he apprehended the burgler responsible for 35 break-ins. These incidents were the catalyst behind the neighborhood seeking a private security patrol. As the story goes, Dr. Linton Hopkins who brought Barry to Brookwood Hills, after he was pulled over by Barry 19 years ago. It was Dr. Hopkins that suggested to Barry that Brookwood Hills was looking for someone to do private security patrol. And so, Dr. Hopkins got a ticket and Barry got a job. # Luna Si

Luna Si is a good spot to have a quiet meal at a reasonable price. The atmosphere is casual ecletic. And, you can walk there.

My favorite dishes are the Seared Atlantic Salmon with ginger crust and the Vegetarian Plate. The latter varies according to the day's selection of fresh vegetables but it's always tasty. My husband often chooses the Ravioli of the Day and is rarely disappointed. Once the Angel Hair Pasta with shrimp was a bit blah, but since then it has been back up to par.

All the salads are delicious and we enjoy the big hunks of country italian bread with ricotta cheese spread that is in constant supply. But, be careful not to fill up on the bread: the desserts are always tempting, with selections like a warm chocolate torte and homemade ice creams.

The menu is a single page but there is definitely something for everyone. New selections are added seasonally. They do what they do well and don't try to do too much. This food is not about ultra fusion where a flood of flavors overwhelm the palate. The wines by the glass are good and reasonably priced too.

The last time we were there the service was good. I was disappointed that the trademark white butcher paper was gone as were the crayons. But I suppose that may be a plus for some patrons.
