



JESSICA STOKES KEEPS NCAA TITLE

Jessica Stokes, a senior at Williams College and daughter of Esther and Jim Stokes of 129 Palisades, defended her national title in the 200-yard medley at the NCAA Division III Nationals on March 11-13. Jessica has been a national champion for three consecutive years, first winning the title in 1997 in the 200-yard freestyle. In this her last NCAA National competition, she placed second in the 100-yard butterfly with a school record time of 56.95, nearly a second and a half off the record of this past season. The same day she anchored the 800-yard freestyle team to a third place seat, beating the UC San Diego team in the last 50 yards.

Jessica began swimming at the Brookwood Hills pool when she was six. She was head coach of the BWH team in 1995 and 1996. She is the senior co-captain of the Williams swim team and received the Kay Former Award as the senior who has scored the most points over her four years in the New England swimming competition. Jessica will graduate

from Williams this spring and plans to teach at the American International School in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates in the fall.

JPDATE FROM GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

Larry Pless and I recently met with Marcia Brinkley, Community Resource Specialist, with the City of Atlanta to discuss some City service issues of particular concern to Brookwood Hills residents. The following

is a recap of our discussion.

One area of primary concern among many Brookwood Hills homeowners is speeding. We are on the wait list to have the City install speed humps on Huntington and Brighton roads. While we are hopeful that the humps will be installed soon, there is a desire to address the immediate problem of increased traffic due to construction both inside and outside the neighborhood. Ms. Brinkley suggested that we report any speeding commercial vehicles to their companies immediately. She mentioned this has been very useful in other areas of the city. Most companies will respond quickly if they find out that their employees are violating traffic laws.

The second issue that we reviewed was the final paving of Parkdale around the sight of the former sinkhole. The city plans to finish work there as soon as they are sure that the problem has been fixed and that no additional work is needed. Ms. Brinkley said the final review should be completed shortly and the work fin-

ished.

Finally, we discussed two issues that deal with code enforcement. The first involves the run-off that is seen on Palisades and Montclair. Some neighbors believe that this is not water, but some type of oily substance that may be coming from a business on Peachtree. Ms. Brinkley will report this to code enforcement so that a determination can be made as to the necessary action that must be taken.

The second code enforcement issue deals with the condition of our neighborhood sidewalks. Marcia reminded us that individual homeowners are responsible for maintaining their sidewalks. The city can only cite a homeowner for failure to keep the sidewalk in proper condition if a complaint is lodged. The City does not monitor sidewalk conditions. We have the option of contracting with the city to have the necessary maintenance work done or working with a local contractor to do the work to City specifications. The City will usually do the work at a lower cost, but currently has a long line of projects. An independent contractor can often complete the project in a more timely manner. However, before undertaking any sidewalk work, it is extremely important to take into consideration the health and welfare of any trees whose root systems may be affected by sidewalk repair.

Related to our code enforcement discussion, Marcia mentioned that the City offers a two-day seminar for a neighborhood volunteer to be trained in code enforcement. This person would then be able to deal effectively with code issues as they arise without having to involve the City. If you are interested in this training,


