

Park and Pool Projects Near Completion

This year's pool season brings with it major improvements to the amenities of the Brookwood Hills Community Club. Our pool, tennis courts, swimming pool and park restrooms are all undergoing a major renovation that will enhance the experience for our members. The most visible change will likely be at the pool pavilion. Joe Noah & Associates, in collaboration with Square Feet Studios and Silverman Construction Project Management, have completed an expansion that includes a dramatically larger deck to accommodate club functions and rentals. The restrooms have been expanded and have more showers and stalls. Please note that the men's and women's rooms have been switched with this renovation. The larger women's room is on the right while the men's room is on the left. Final city inspection was completed on April 16th and the pavilion is ready for the season. In conjunction with this project, Joe Noah & Associates also updated the restrooms in the park, installing new tile and fixtures.

While Noah was hard at work on the pavilion, Aquatic Solutions, Inc. has been renovating our pool. The bottom has been resurfaced and the bulkhead has been widened and extended. This change to the bulkhead has allowed us to widen the lanes and accommodate starting blocks, which will help to speed along our swim meets. A new gutter system will greatly improve water flow. Additionally, we have made the area between the rope and the dive well a bit shallower. Final plastering of the pool bottom is expected to take place the week of April 20th after which the pool will be filled and we'll be ready for the swim and dive teams.

Now that the pavilion construction has been completed, renovation of the tennis courts will begin during the week of April 27th and

should last about two weeks. Signature Tennis will install the Rebound Ace surface, a state-of-the-art court that was used at the Australian Open for years. The courts will be unavailable for a couple of weeks during this project.

Brookwood Hills already had one of the best community club facilities in Atlanta. With the completion of these projects, we really have a club to be envied.

Into the Woods

Recently I met with Andrew Walter, the Greenway Acquisition Property Manager for Atlanta and representatives of Southeast Pipe Surveying Co. Southeast has a contract with Atlanta to survey and clean out the sewers in certain areas, including the wooded land of our Conservation Easement. They have been working on a sewer line east of the creek that enters our property at the concrete batch plant near Armour and Slaton Drives and connects with the 54 inch trunk line built in 2000. From there they are moving to the main line on the neighborhood side of the creek behind the houses along Huntington, middle Camden and lower Camden. This work requires tracked, heavy equipment and a number of workers in the woods. Andrew is working with Southeast to mitigate any disturbance to the Greenway.

Progress has been made in our 5-year program to replace invasive plants with native species in our marvelous green space. If you are interested in seeing this for yourself I recommend sturdy shoes, long pants and socks (poison ivy protection), and going with at least one other person. There are two ways to enter the property on the neighborhood side of the creek without trespassing on private property: at the base of Palisades between 205 and 220 Huntington, or directly behind the neighborhood swing next to 147 Huntington. The less adventuresome can go to brookwoodhills.com to see newly taken pictures of our land. Under "New Developments" click on "Clear Creek Update Pictures."

The Brookwood Opens May 1

Many neighbors have expressed curiosity about The Brookwood, the new residential building located at the corner of Palisades and Peachtree. The project encompasses 219 homes with street level retail/restaurant space. The developers hope to bring in a high quality restaurant, as well as a coffee shop for early morning coffee and pastries. Mark Riley of Urban Realty Partners recently sent word to *BrookNotes* that the building will be completed May 1st. Mark wrote: "Our goal has been to create a landmark residence that will set the tone for the redevelopment of this historic part of Peachtree and we look forward to being an active part of the Brookwood neighborhood for many years to come. We understand that you have had to deal with noise from construction and traffic disruption as we complete our streetscapes, and we greatly appreciate your patience as we wrap up construction."

Brookwood Hills Security Update

For over thirty years your community club dues have made possible a security patrol made up of off-duty Atlanta police officers, overseen by retired officer Barry Miller. Throughout the years our neighborhood has seen a decrease in invasive crimes, but petty crimes such as car break-ins do continue to occur. As a resident and member of the community club it is important for you to be familiar with the procedures to report an incident and also for you to be aware of your surroundings.

- For everything from solicitations to invasive crimes **call 911**. Officer Miller's team monitors the police radio and will be aware of any incident.
- After calling 911, call 404/242-3321. This is the private phone that the security patrol officers keep with them while on duty.
- Next, call 404/355-3707 (h) or 404/771-1178 (c) to report the incident to me, your Security Chair, Lisa Barnhart.

When an incident occurs, I will place a security alert sign (yellow for petty crimes, red for more serious incidents) at the 3 entrances to the neighborhood. To learn the details of the incident, call the Security Hotline at 404/325-5114, where I will have left a recorded message. Note that the Hotline is *not* used to report crimes. But if you are going out of town and would like the security patrol to periodically check on your house, you should call the Hotline and leave a message with your name, address, and dates you will be away.

As your Security Chair through 2011, I am the person to call to obtain a BWH parking sticker for your car. Officer Miller says these stickers are a big help to the security patrol because any car without a sticker merits more attention from the officers. I can also get directly in touch with Officer Miller, which I did earlier this month when fallen trees rendered a house open to both human and natural elements. Officer Miller was able to contact the homeowners to let them know of the need for 24 hour surveillance of their property until it could be secured.

Remember, it is your membership in the community club that pays for the patrol. And it is your awareness of your surroundings that will keep you and your immediate neighbors safe.
