

This one day in the year helps us to continue the efforts to replace the trees that we have lost and will continue to lose over the years. I should not enter and run unless I am medically able and properly trained to complete the course in less than 1.5 hours. I agree to abide by any decision of a race official relative to my ability to safely complete the run. I understand that the course will be closed once runners doing a 1.5hr pace have passed. I assume all risks associated with running in the 2006 "Around Peachtree Battle" SK including but not limited to falls, contact with other participants, the effects of weather, including high heat and/or humidity, traffic and the conditions of the road, all such risks being known and appreciated by me. Having read this waiver and knowing these facts and in consideration of your accepting my entry, I, for myself and anyone on who's half I am entitled to act, waive and release JT and Vanessa King, Atlanta Union Mission, all city, county and state governments, their representatives and successors from all claims or liabilities of any kind arising out of my participating in this event. I understand that all entries are final with no refunds. The official race director reserves the right in any event of emergency or local or national disaster to cancel the race or to change thee day and or time to a later day and that in the event of cancellation or change there is no guaranteed refund of entry fees.

## **Zoning Frequently Asked Questions**

Understanding the rules and regulations around building, renovating and/or remodeling can be confusing. In an effort to demystify the process, Brooknotes will periodically run answers to frequently asked questions. These will also be posted on the Brookwood Hills web site starting in the first quarter of the new year.

#### How do I know if I need a building permit?

Basically, if you are undertaking any renovation/remodel project on with your house or garden that goes beyond routine maintenance, the City of Atlanta requires you to get a permit. While most contractors are familiar with the permitting process and are willing to get the necessary permits on behalf of their clients, it is the homeowners responsibility to make sure that all required permits are obtained and that any neighborhood requirements are met. When you present your plans to the City for a permit, they will inform you if you are required to obtain any variances (Note: step by step procedures for obtaining variances will be posted on the Brookwood Hills web site in the first quarter of 2006). #### What is meant by the term "set back" lines?

Set back lines are established from each of the 4 borders of your property. The zoning laws prohibit any structure from being built over the set back lines without first obtaining a variance from the Board of Zoning Adjustments. The set back requirements for R-4 residential properties are 35' for the front yard, 7' for each side of the lot and 15' for the rear yard.

## Be a Better Neighbor!

There are always a few things we all can do to be better neighbors, following are some suggestions:

- If your neighbor is out of town, pick up their newspapers and toss them by their back door.
- If you have a large pile of trash (household appliances, old furniture, etc.) call the city and arrange a special pickup, our regular trash service will not take large items and they can end up sitting by the curb for weeks.
- Don't nail things to our beautiful trees, their lives are tough enough without our doing extra damage.
- If your street light goes out call Georgia Power and asked for it to be fixed, they are very prompt when they receive calls.
- If you are walking or running in the neighborhood after dark wear a reflective vest, drivers cannot see you!
- Clean up after yourself and your children in the park, this is a wonderful benefit of living in Brookwood Hills and we all share responsibility for taking care of it.
- Promptly report security incidents so information can be properly communicated to other neighbors.
- Keep track of your contractors and work people, make sure they and their equipment are parked safely and as out of the way as possible, and that they keep their worksite clean and orderly.
- Dispose of your yard trash properly and make sure it does not clog our street drains.
- Clean up after your pet, the amount of pet waste on our neighborhood streets and sidewalks is unsanitary.




