
- NPU & Zoning Co-Chair (shared with Lee Morris)

Annual Neighborhood Tree Planting Breaks Records

On Saturday, December 5th, 2009, Tree Chair Boyd Gentry headed up neighbors of all ages, plus volunteers from both Hanbit Presbyterian Church in Duluth and Trees Atlanta for the annual planting of new and replacement trees. Everyone met at the Pavilion for bagels and orientation before planting over fifty trees throughout the neighborhood and park. The participants set a new Brookwood Hills record for the number of trees planted in a single day. Trees were also planted in the Clear Creek Preserve for the first time.

A big issue for our neighborhood is that our wonderful, towering water oaks were planted almost one hundred years ago. Since these trees are a single species planted at the same time with a restricted root environment, they are all dying at the same time. The strategy now is to plant a variety of trees that will continuously renew with abundance at all different phases of their lives. Several of the trees planted this year went into neighbors' front yards, where they will have more root room and where they

will not have to contend with Georgia Power wires overhead as they grow taller and spread out.

Trees Atlanta, a non-profit group that is passionate about reforesting metro Atlanta, has partnered with Brookwood Hills for six years in their Neighborwoods Program which is built upon the assumption of volunteer "sweat equity" planting support. Prior to that, between the 1995 ordeal of destructive Hurricane Opal and 2003, the Community Club and Garden Club planted trees with Bold Springs Nursery and Gunn Landscaping. Since 1996, the two initiatives have installed approximately 475 trees in Brookwood Hills.


Next year's date is still being finalized but is targeted for the first Saturday in November when the weather will hopefully be warmer. The Community Club has set as a goal to increase the number of neighbors who help out with the planting next year. Every one of us has benefitted from the efforts of volunteers outside of Brookwood Hills, like the good folks from Hanbit Presbyterian Church and the other regular volunteers to Trees Atlanta who showed up on December 5th. Without them, we never would have been able to install the trees made available to us this year. Next year please consider volunteering for the benefit of Brookwood Hills and the trees we love. A strong showing from the neighborhood ensures our future involvement in the Neighborwoods Program.

Thank you to all the neighborhood street captains for your hard work and leadership this year. Many thanks also to Chris Hastings and his company, Arbormedics, for donating an entire dump truck load of mulch for the planting.

Don't Forget Our Men In Blue

Here's a reminder that it is the time of year when we recognize the efforts of our security team with a year-end holiday bonus. Despite all the attention paid to crime in the recent mayoral race, this has been one of the quietest years on record for Brookwood Hills. The visibility of our security patrol is a big reason for that. Hopefully you've had the opportunity to meet and personally thank these officers who protect our homes and families.

Keep in mind Officer Barry Miller's Safety Tips for the Holidays:

- Always leave outside lights on at night.
- Keep cars empty and unlocked (no more need to replace smashed windows).
- Do not place empty boxes (for new computers, televisions, etc.) on the street.
- Pick up packages at doors immediately (neighbors helping neighbors).
- Call the BWH security hotline (404-325-5114) for home surveillance while away.
- Call 911 to report suspicious activity. Then call 404-242-3321, the cell phone carried by the security patrol when they are on duty. And finally please call me at 404-771-1178 (cell) or 404-355-3707 (home) so that I will be aware of any incidents.

If you choose to participate in the security bonus, please make your check payable to Brookwood Hills Community Club, with "Security Bonus" in the memo line. Your check should be dropped off at my home, 310 Camden Road. Many thanks for your generosity.

Brighton Road Entrance Update

After two years of planning, work has finally begun on the Brighton Road entrance. As you may recall, The Brookwood Hills Garden Club and the Community Club are jointly paying for the renovation that will include new hardscape and plantings. This work should be completed by the end of the month. In January, two pillars and a neighborhood marker will be installed by Noah and Associates to identify the entrance to our neighborhood. All efforts will be made to minimize disruption to egress and ingress, but there will be some occasions when the Brighton Road entrance will be blocked while pavers are installed in the roadway. Thank you for you patience while this project is ongoing.

Christmas Tree Mulching Schedule

All Brookwood Hills neighbors are requested to be good stewards of our natural resources by participating in the post-Christmas mulching of trees, made available through the Community Club. Starting December 25th, Christmas trees -- with all decorations and lights removed -- can be taken to the nature trail where it ends at Huntington Road. An easy way to get your tree to the collection point is to tie it to the back of your car with a rope and drag it to the appointed spot. No pick-up trucks or major muscles required! On Monday, January 11th, the trees will be ground up, with the mulch available for use throughout the neighborhood. Please do not deposit any trees at the Parkdale entrance to the park. At one time this served as a second collection point, but it is no longer appropriate for you to leave your tree on that side of the park. Thanks in advance for your participation in this program.
