Long-Range Plan for the Brookwood Hills Park

The Brookwood Hills Board is pleased to announce the commencement of a new 5-year plan for our beautiful park. The park is facing several maintenance issues, and we feel that decisions about these issues are best made in the context of a big picture plan. The plan will seek to maintain the character and charm of the park while maximizing its safety and functionality.

A Park Planning Committee consisting of Betsy Armentrout, Ramsay Battin, Bobbi Hurt, Joy Lusk and Alli Richardson is spearheading this initiative.

At the recommendation of the Park Planning Committee, the Board has selected HGOR, Planners and Landscape Architects, to help develop the plan.

HGOR was selected because of their deep experience with landscape and park planning, including popular projects at Piedmont Park, Lovett School and the Pool Pavillion right here in Brookwood Hills, as well as their collaborative approach to design.



To begin the process, HGOR will facilitate a survey and several town hall meetings to solicit input from all neighbors. Please look for more details in future issues of BrookNotes.

First of Grant Trees Planted in the Preserve

The installation of trees from the first of two grants awarded to BWHCC was completed in November. As a result of the Love Your Block Grant received this past summer, fifteen trees were planted along Armour and Clayton Drive adjacent to Armour Industrial Park.

The magnolia, red maple and pine trees were strategically placed as part of an effort to provide some relief to those residents with views of buildings inside the park. The Love Your Block Grant is funded by the City of Atlanta.

A second grant, sponsored by Keep America Beautiful, will serve to subsidize the installation of sixty-one additional trees in the coming weeks, most of which will be located closer to the trail on the west side of Clear Creek. Thank you to Ramsay Battin for securing the Love Your Block Grant.



Brookwood Hills Security

With the new year approaching, here is an introduction to the BWH Security Procedures for the new neighbors and a refresher for our current residents.

| Security Concern or Request | Recommended Action |
|--|--|
| There was a break-in or attempted break-in at your home or car. You see suspicious activity in the neighborhood. A solicitor has come to your door to try to sell something. | First, call 911. Then, call the Security Patrol cell phone at (404) 242-3321. Finally, report the incident to BWH Security Chair Gregory Fiore by texting or calling (657) 229-4728. |
| You see yellow or red Security Alert signs at a BWH entrance. | Call the BWH Security Hotline at (404) 325-5114 to listen to a recorded message with details about the incident. |
| You are going out of town. | Call the BWH Security Hotline at (404) 325-5114 to provide your address and the dates you will be away. |
| You need a Brookwood Hills parking sticker for your car. | Gregory Fiore distributes the BWH parking stickers. Text your request to (657) 229-4728, or Email your request to security@brookwoodhills.com. |

Security Phone Numbers

- 911 You should call 911 for everything from solicitations to invasive crimes.
- Security Patrol Cell Phone: (404) 242-3321
 You can call this number for questions about security in the neighborhood or in the case of an incident, after you have called 911.
- BWH Security Chair: (657) 229–4728

 To report incidents or ask questions, call or text Security Chair Gregory Fiore at (657) 229-4728, or email him at security@brookwoodhills.com.
- BWH Security Hotline: (404) 325-5114
 There are two reasons to call the Hotline:
 - 1. You see Security Alert signs at the entrances to the neighborhood.
 - Yellow Security Alert signs indicate multiple petty crimes.
 - **Red** Security Alert signs indicate an armed crime or home invasion has occurred.

Are you hesitant to call 911?

Sgt. Barry Miller of our security patrol has said that one of his biggest challenges is to convince people to call 911, even though this is the appropriate response in many cases.

He addressed the hesitancy to call 911 when he spoke at the last BWH Annual Meeting: "Does anybody in this room feel they don't pay enough taxes to call on your police?"

Call 911 before the Security Patrol

Calling the Security Patrol before 911 could delay response as there might not be an officer on duty then.

Sgt. Miller and his patrol members carry radios that are tuned to the Atlanta Police Zone 2 radio frequency so they hear the 911 reports at the same time the Zone 2 patrol officers do.

Our Security Patrol

Retired from the Atlanta Police Department after 30+ year career, Sgt. Barry Miller leads a group of retired and off-duty officers who patrol our neighborhood and others in the Buckhead area.

You may see the officers driving in the neighborhood on Atlanta Police motorcycles or in marked non-police vehicles. Sgt. Miller's patrol service has served and protected our neighborhood for over 30 years.

In our neighborhood, the security patrol is financed by the Brookwood Hills Community Club. A large percentage of the membership dues cover the associated costs.

Throughout the years, our neighborhood has seen a lessening of the more invasive crimes as well as petty crimes thanks to this patrol.

As a Brookwood Hills resident, it is important to join the community club to contribute to our security programs. You should also be aware of your surroundings and know the procedures to report an incident.

Crime Prevention Tips

The holidays are here, and unfortunately, it means an increase in crime. With the help of our security officers, I have put together some holiday security tips.

Solicitation

BWH is a no solicitation neighborhood. City ordinance makes it illegal to solicit in our neighborhood. If someone knocks on your door unexpectedly, please do not open it. Let the solicitor know that it is illegal to solicit. Next, call 911. Then, you may call our security patrol and finally, notify the BWH Security Chair Gregory Fiore.

Gifts

Leaving gifts out in the open, whether inside your car or visible through a home window, should be avoided. Also, be a good neighbor and be aware of neighbors' packages. Please move packages from the front of their homes to a secure location.

• Boxes

Please do not leave boxes or other packaging from expensive items on the curb. This advertises big ticket items and attracts crime. Boxes can be turned inside out or brought to the curb on the morning of trash pick-up.

Suspicious Activity

Thank you to the neighbors who continue to report suspicious behavior. If you notice suspicious activity or feel unsafe at anytime, please call 911. Then, call the security patrol, and finally, report the incident to Gregory Fiore, BWH Security Chair. If it is safe to do so, take pictures with your cell phone or camera. These may be helpful to the security officers.

Lighting

A well-lit house is less of a target than a dark one. Using LED bulbs reduces the cost of electricity, there is no reason to have a dark home. This goes for inside the home, where timers are effective, as well as outside the home.

Travel

If you will be away, please call the BWH Security Hotline (404) 325-5114 to provide your address and travel dates. The security patrol will check on your home while you are away. Do not publicize on social media that you are traveling.
