## Brookwood Hills Steps Up In Haiti

All over the world there has been an outpouring of care and concern for the people of Haiti since the disastrous earthquake that struck the country on January 12th. This issue of *BrookNotes* contains three separate articles about the actions of current and former Brookwood Hills residents who couldn't allow themselves to remain bystanders. I feel sure there are other neighbors who could add their own inspiring stories to these three.

Huntington Road resident David Lee started his own business, Trinity Aviation Group, about ten years ago. His company is a little bit like a real estate firm, only for airplanes. If I wanted to buy a small aircraft for myself, David could help me figure out what kind of plane would fit my needs and where I could buy it for the best price. He could then arrange for an inspection of the plane to ensure its safety, and negotiate the sale. Over the years David has built up quite a list of airplane owners, which

proved invaluable when eleven Atlanta residents found themselves stranded on the Haitian

island of La Gonave, where they were staying at the time of the quake. David put the word out and within four days two volunteer pilots landed a small plane on La Gonave's beach to bring ten of the eleven home. (The eleventh person was former Palisades Road resident and physician Jim Ingvoldstad, who spent another week on the mainland to provide care for those injured.)

David soon connected with one of those evacuated, former Brookwood Hills swim team star Graham Huff, to begin ferrying supplies to Haiti. Graham had developed the expertise to install water purification systems in remote areas of the country. Now anyplace with significant damage had a need for access to clean water. David and Graham flew some 50,000 pounds of supplies to Leogane, a suburb of Port au Prince virtually atop the epicenter of the quake. They first flew to the Dominican Republic. From there they headed to Leogane, landing on a two lane road that had been cleared for them by United Nations soldiers from Sri Lanka. Trucks met the plane and carried the supplies on to a nursing school, one of the few buildings still standing there. Thanks to their efforts, Leogane now has a water purification system that can sustain 6,000 people for a year. (Cont'd. page 4)

## **Mayor Reed Addresses Annual Meeting**

On Sunday, January 24th, a surprisingly large turnout of neighbors braved the miserably rainy weather to attend the Community Club's Annual Meeting at the Rich Auditorium of Piedmont Hospital. For the first time in many years (maybe ever?) our city's mayor took the time to speak to us at this event. Kasim Reed held the floor for about forty-five minutes, with a short talk followed by a Q&A session. He spoke about his determination to bring in federal dollars for city projects such as the Peachtree streetcar and his determination not to raise property taxes during his first term. The biggest challenge facing the city this year, he said, is to deal with the pension crisis, where more was promised to employees than can feasibly be delivered. He is conducting national searches for the next Chiefs of Police & Fire, CFO, City Attorney, and Public Works Chief. He gave a vote of confidence to Rob Hunter, the current chief of Watershed Management. He pledged to vigorously oppose the creation of a Milton County, which he said would be disastrous for the City, for Grady and for MARTA.

After reports from Community Club President John Mulcahy, Ramsay Battin (Treasurer), Joe Gardner (NPU & Zoning) and Lesley Carroll (Pool), Lisa Barnhart presented Barry Miller with an expression of gratitude for his 30 years of service patrolling Brookwood Hills.

SWIM TEAM REGISTRATION: Swim Team registration is now available online.

STEP 1: Enter your swimmer's information at http://bwh.Swim-Team.us by April 20<sup>th</sup> to avoid late fees. Please make sure you enter each swimmer. The website will figure your fees; then you will make a check out to BWHCC and mail your payment to Kerri Clark, 2119 Howell Mill Road; Atlanta, GA 30318. If you have trouble with this site, please make sure you turn off your popup blockers. DO NOT USE THE PAYPAL PAYMENT FUNCTION. WE ARE ONLY ACCEPTING CHECKS!!

STEP 2: Swimmers must also register and pay nominal dues at the Atlanta Swimming Website at www.atlantaswimming.com. There is a very important waiver that each swimmer needs to agree to. If you do not perform this function at Atlanta Swimming your child will not be able to swim in any Swim Meet. Please complete this process by April 1st to avoid incurring late fees from Atlanta Swimming.

Thanks too, to Huntington Road residents Wendy and Todd Silliman, who raised funds to help underwrite the cost of the flight. David has flown three missions so far, with a fourth planned soon. He points out that, while big cargo planes can bring in vastly more equipment and supplies, there is a big bottleneck in getting things out from the Port au Prince airport. Light planes can get to places others can't, and David is working now with the Episcopalian

church of Haiti (which has the largest Episcopalian Diocese in the world) to air drop supplies into extremely remote areas still cut off from help.

There's much more to this story which you can read about by visiting Graham's blog at leagueofhope.blogspot.com/. It is filled with pictures from the Leogane trip, and there is a link to a video showing David landing his plane on the road/runway. Graham is in the process of setting up his organization League of Hope as a 501C-3 which will ultimately be able to receive tax-deductible contributions. In the meantime, First Presbyterian Church of Atlanta is accepting funds to underwrite League of Hope flights. David's fourth trip will happen once a final \$6,000 is raised to pay for the

## Report From Haiti

As news of Haiti's recent quake reached Atlanta, former Brookwood Hills resident Steve McCollam, who is in charge of Peachtree Orthopaedic Clinic's 53 year old volunteer program at the Hospital Albert Schweitzer (HAS) in Haiti, received an e-mail from the hospital director reporting they were becoming rapidly overwhelmed and were very low on supplies. HAS, which is located fifty miles north of Port au Prince, was one of the few hospitals in Haiti left standing. An ABC News report indicated there were 500 patients for this 80-bed facility.

Steve e-mailed Peachtree Orthopaedic Clinic (POC) physicians (active and retired) as well as physicians and surgical staff at Piedmont Hospital and the Georgia Orthopaedic Society, asking for volunteers and medical supplies. The response was immediate and generous. With doctors, nurses and supplies in place, the question was how to get there with the Port au Prince airport closed to commercial flights.

The solution came when Piedmont Hospital arranged for its plane to carry a medical team of six—three orthopaedic surgeons, an anesthesiologist and two OR nurses—and medical supplies. On January 20th the small plane landed at Cap Hatien's airport on Haiti's northern coast, where HAS vehicles met them for the five-hour ride on winding mountain roads to the hospital. As soon as they arrived, team members went to work, busy until ten or later each evening caring for fifteen or more femur and other bone fractures (Cont'd next page)


daily in the OR. (HAS general surgeons performed most of the amputations. When the medical team returned to Atlanta four days later, the backlog of orthopaedic patients was under control, a Canadian medical team had arrived and the influx of patients from Port au Prince slowed as the price of diesel fuel rose four-fold.

Other teams from POC and Piedmont Hospital will travel to Haiti over the next several months. The Georgia Orthopaedic Society is working with hospitals throughout the state for donations of pain medicines and antibiotics. Steve points out that there's "more work to be done as thousands will need revision surgery and many yet will unfortunately die of sepsis [infection]. It will truly be a lost generation that will impact Haiti for decades to come."

In addition to Steve, Brookwood Hills' Haiti connection has included physicians Skoot Dimon, Xavier Duralde and Carl Fackler, as over the years POC has sent small teams to HAS every four months. For more information on the hospital, see <u>www.hashaiti.org</u>.
