TD: I have been transforming dull knives into sharp knives since 2011.

BN: How did you come up with the idea to start your own business? Do you have a mentor who inspired you or someone who helped you think the idea through?


TD: Knife sharpening has been a tradition among males in my family. My grandpa was a knife sharpener as a boy, and my father after him, so now I carry on the tradition.

BN: What are your goals with your business?

TD: My goal is to provide an affordable knife sharpening service that delivers a quality product.

BN: What advice do you have to other young people who are interested in taking their talents and creating a business?

TD: Make signs! Make posters! Always get back to your clients, whether you can work for them or not.

I'll bring your knives to my house at 122 Huntington Road where I'll sharpen them, and then I'll hurry back to return them. I use a Grizzly Wet Grinder model T10010 to put a new edge on the knives. Satisfaction guaranteed.


Directions to Rich Auditorium:

Input from Brookwood Hills Neighbors

Why do your kids want to go to the park?


- Socialize and play with friends

The theater conducts classes and workshops on theater performance and production management, directs a vibrant Junior Company of middle and high school students, and offers talented high school and college students internships, in which they study all aspects of theater performance and stage management and serve as teaching artists for the summer camp productions.



Young Artists Series

Fabrefaction's Young Artists series has staged student performances of *Hairspray*, Bye Bye Birdie, The Trial of Goldilocks, Once Upon a Mattress, Charlotte's Web, Spring Awakening, and Little Shop of Horrors, as well as a number of Disney Kids and Junior productions like Cinderella and Sleeping Beauty. Brookwood Hills has been consistently represented among large casts of kids drawn to Fabrefaction from all over the Atlanta area.

BWH neighbor Rachel Doman, a 4th grader at Trinity School, has performed in eleven plays and musicals over the past three years, with her favorite playing Cruella de Vil in 101 Dalmatians and the Mad Hatter in Alice in Wonderland. Jeb Carter, an 8th grader at Pace Academy, is a BWH community club member who has been on stage with Fabrefaction in both educational and collaborative productions, notably playing key roles in The Music Man, Titanic: The Musical, and Seussical the Musical.

While Fabrefaction's primary mission is to train young actors, the theater has received acclaim and awards for its professional shows, particularly Sweeney Todd, Stephen Sondheim's Assassins, Urinetown, and The Odd Couple, which have played on both its main stage and black box theaters. Many of Atlanta's young, up-and-coming directors, actors, and designers have discovered Fabrefaction and are increasingly active in its professional shows. They also lend their creative and mentoring talents to the kids in the student productions – which, of course, the kids love!

A Musical Willy Wonka

This spring, actors in grades 1-12 will take to the stage alongside professional adult actors in the "scrumdidilyumptious" new musical adaptation of Ronald Dahl's *Willy Wonka*. More than a dozen pros will bring Willy Wonka and the other adult roles to life, but it's the kids who will steal the spotlight in the roles of the children with the elusive Golden Tickets, chefs, animals, and – of course – the ever popular Oompa Loompas. *Willy Wonka* will be performed Thursday, April 24 – Sunday, May 11 on Fabrefaction's main stage. Twenty-nine students are in the production: 9 elementary, 21 middle school, and 9 high school.

All of the student roles are double-cast to accommodate schedule conflicts (many play sports) and to balance the demands of school, family, and theater performances; most students are scheduled for no more than 8 out of 16 total performances. Jeb will be playing the TV-addicted boy Mike Teavee, while Rachel will be playing multiple minor roles as a member of the ensemble.

More than Training for the Stage

As part of their Fabrefaction experience, in addition to professional training, the student actors receive production photos, group shots, portraits in costume, and professional headshots. The show's directors assign individual mentorships, too, so that each student has an older or more experienced student or professional actor to offer support and guidance throughout the twelve weeks of classes, rehearsals, and performances. Middle and high school students also have the opportunity for hands-on experience in design/tech, direction, and stage management. Interested parents are included, as well, with the option of attending three seminars scheduled during the rehearsals to learn about acting resumes, audition prep, equity vs. non-equity roles, and much more. Finally, eve-

ry actor receives two complimentary tickets with their tuition and more are available to family members who volunteer their time during the build process or as ushers/concession assistants for the performances.
