Office Condos to Rise in Brookwood Area

By Milo Ippolito, Staff Writer AJC More bricks are on the way to Brookwood.

Developers plan to build an 11-story brick office building on Peachtree Road next to Huey's restaurant and across the street from Café Intermezzo. When the development sign went up, neighbors saw it as the latest indication that more changes are in store for the stretch of Peachtree between the Amtrak station and Piedmont Hospital.

"It's just another step toward making this area cleaner, fresher, more active, more vital," said Cafe Intermezzo owner Brian Olson.

The new building would replace a Wendy's restaurant. The burned out Mayflower apartments next door on the corner of Peachtree and 28th Street are not part of the development property. The future of the apartments, a row of historic brick buildings facing 28th Street, is in limbo, and Fire Department officials say an arson investigation is ongoing.

The office building's exterior, "brick with precast limestone accents,"borrows its style from "the classic architecture that's found throughout the Brookwood area," said Marc Fritz, vice president of the Griffin Co., an office developer. The traditional, brick look is consistent with the area's historic apartment buildings, the Amtrak station and the Brookwood Place mixed-use, residential and commercial development alongside I-85, Fritz said. Another similarity with Brookwood Place is the inclusion of street-level storefronts. The developers hope to attract a bank branch and a coffeehouse with an outdoor patio. Over the past year, Brookwood Place has added to its street space a Kroger, Borders bookstore, Spa Sydell, Viking Culinary Arts Center and Wolfgang Puck's Express Cafe.

"It's just more synergy in the area for everyone," Fritz said.

But some area restaurateurs see a future in which the rising real estate values may eventually squeeze out neighborhood institutions such as Huey's, a Cajun restaurant, and R. Thomas Deluxe Grill, a 24-hour health food restaurant, both in business for more than 20 years.

"It's going to be an issue when this lease expires in a number of years," said Scot Rittenbaum, a partner in Huey's.

The developers say they hope the colorful, local restaurants survive.

"We're glad they're in the neighborhood," Griffin Vice President Kirk Demetrops said. "They've all been there since as long as I could remember."

The developers say they must pre-sell about 35 percent of the office building to secure financing and (Continued on page 3)

break ground.

Griffin could have aimed higher than 11 stories, Fritz said, but stuck with a size that meets the estimated demand.

"It just needed to be a smaller, boutique building to sell it," Fritz said.

The company specializes in office condos, a niche market, and does not intend to lease space, he said.

Buyers could include stable businesses such as law firms, accounting firms and medical practices, Fritz and Demetrops said.

A parking deck would be built beneath and behind the

The driveway would line up with the Palisades Road traffic light, a plus for entering and exiting in the congested area.

Griffin hopes to break ground around March and deliver office space in the middle of 2005.

A year of construction could hurt business at Huey's, which serves half its customers on the patio, Rittenbaum said.

"If there's a jackhammer pounding, I don't know how many people are going to want to sit on the patio," he said.

Its Time to Renew Your Community Club Membership

It is time to renew your Community Club membership. The Community Club offers three memberships for BWH residents. The A membership provides access to the pool, park and tennis facilities as well as helping fund our neighborhood security patrol, maintain and protect our Clear Creek property, and otherwise support the Board's efforts to work on the neighborhood's behalf in zoning, traffic and beautification issues. The annual dues for an A membership are \$600. Along with the A membership, two reduced rate memberships are offered.

The B membership covers the costs associated with our security patrol, park maintenance, and other zoning and beautification issues, but does not include use of the pool and tennis facilities. Annual dues at this level are \$225.

The S (senior/grandparent) membership is available to neighbors 60 or older, and offers all the benefits of the A level membership at the reduced cost of \$400 per year. You should have received your renewal forms in the last couple of weeks. If you would like to change your membership category please note the change on your renewal form and submit the correct dues amount.

Please remit your check, in the appropriate amount, to the Brookwood Hills Community Club in the envelope enclosed in your renewal package by February 15, 2004.

The BWHCC Board voted to begin the membership renewal process earlier this year as it gives us more time to determine membership levels, determine how many C memberships will be available and because we have had challenges with the timely submission of dues in the past, which can be a problem, especially before the pool season begins.
