

BROOKWOOD HILLS EMBARKS ON LONG-RANGE PLAN

Brookwood Hills has retained the nationally recognized urban design firm of Hughes, Good, O'Leary and Ryan to develop a Master Plan for our neighborhood.

They will make a presentation at the Annual Meeting to show us "where we are" as we begin this process. The target date for completing the Master Plan is June 5, 2000.

We have also established a steering committee to work with HGOR, and to relay information to you and vice versa. Speed Hump Update

Representatives from the neighborhood and Board of Directors met with Sandra Jennings and Nursef Kedir from the City of Atlanta Transportation Services to discuss the current status of our speed hump installation along with ways to resolve the issues raised by the residents on Palisades Rd. Although it was our understanding that we were scheduled to have speed humps installed in February and March, we actually were at positions number 22 and 27 on the list for installation. Currently, the City is installing about one set of speed humps a month. Thus, under the normal course of things, it would have been more like 2 years before we were actually scheduled for installation. The original order of installation was based on when the City received neighborhood petitions. Over the past two years, we have worked our way up the list from our initial position in the 60's.

Recently, the City was allocated some funding to hopefully expedite the installation of approximately 15 speed humps in the next 30-90 days. At the time of our meeting, the City had two proposals for selecting the 15 streets to receive speed humps. One, install speed humps for the first 15 petitions on the list. Under that scenario we would move up to approximately numbers 7 and 12. Two, reprioritize the list according to need and install the top 15 on the "needy" list. The issue of which list to use was politically unresolved, as those streets which were in the top 15 numerically but not by priority were dissatisfied with the prioritization method. Our streets fell into the top 15 in priority according to Ms. Jennings.

We were advised that the Board of Directors could request that our streets not be placed in any potential expedited programs. If such a request was made, this would give the neighborhood approximately 90 days or so to have a traffic study done which would look at traffic calming measures for the entire neighborhood. Ms. Jennings stated that if we chose not to be in the expedited program, we would move into the top 5 positions on the regular installation list. This would actually leave us in a better position than if the City choose to take the top numerical 15.

Ms. Jennings raised another issue, which may present a bigger problem for our neighborhood. Our streets are in poor condition, and the City will not install speed humps until street repairs are made. Prior to the installation of any speed humps, the City does an evaluation of the paving and assesses whether repaving needs to be done. If there has been a request for repaving or it is apparent that repaving is necessary, the installation of speed humps will be postponed by the City until repaving is completed. This is because speed humps have to be removed for repaving to occur. We have had a request for repaving pending for over 2 years with only Montclair actually receiving any paving. Obviously, this issue will have to be resolved prior to the installation of any traffic calming measures.

The Board voted to request that the City not place our streets in an expedited program (30-90 day installation) if that option becomes available. This will give the land planner approximately 90 days to analyze our situation and propose a resolution to the City. However, the Board did request that our streets remain on the regular speed hump list and retain their assigned position. This will insure that we move to the top of the list if an expedited program is initiated or remain in our current position if a numerical list is chosen.

Both the Board and the City believe this is a reasonable solution that will allow the neighborhood time to have our streets evaluated by a land planner without loosing our place in line if speed humps are found to be the appropriate remedy to our speeding problem.

BWH Residents Play Leadership Roles at Southeastern Flower Show.

Come stroll with us "Through the Garden Gate" -- the theme of this year's Southeastern Flower Show, the largest juried gardening, floral, and horticultural show in the Southeast. This spectacular five-day annual event benefits the Atlanta Botanical Garden, and is produced, directed, and "manned" by volunteers. The core volunteer committee of over 200 men and women was Chaired this year by Wakefield resident Sara Jean Burke, while Camden Road resident Caroline Gilham served as President of the Show's Board of Trustees. Brookwood Hills neighbors Harvie Abney, Linda Copeland, Micki Gambrell, JoAnn Haga-

man, Larre Holladay, Caroline Hooper, Pat Ingvoldstad, Carla Kandola, Elizabeth Martin, Stella Martin, Sandra Player, Terri Thompson, Betty Walker, Karen Welch, and Susan Wimberly also served on the Committee.

The Southeastern Flower Show highlights the talents of both amateur and professional gardeners and floral designers. The Landscape Division has eleven gardens created by professional design companies, while the Education Division offers fourteen beautifully crafted "discovery gardens." The Floral Design Division has some special features this year, including a men's challenge class, and a lovely garden setting showcasing twelve table top designs. The Junior Division allows young gardeners to compete in designing tie-dyed T-shirts, mini-ecosystems, windowsill gardens, wreaths, and treehouses. In addition, nationally renowned speakers and authors conduct daily seminars, and local experts demonstrate garden design and techniques and floral arranging. There also is a retail market and food court available.

The Show runs Wednesday, February 23 through Sunday, February 27, at the Atlanta Exhibition Center. Hours are Wednesday and Thursday, 9:30 am to 7 p.m.; Friday and Saturday, 9:30 am to 8 p.m.; and Sunday 9:30 am to 6 p.m. The Exhibition Center is located on Jonesboro Road, just inside I-285: take I-75 south to I-285; go east on I-285 and take the second exit which is the Jonesboro Road exit. The Exhibition Center is just on the left at the end of the exit ramp. There is plenty of on-site parking.

Tickets to the Show are \$15 at the door, \$11 in advance. There are also \$20 two-day tickets an \$5 youth tickets (ages 4-16) available. Advance tickets may be purchased from the Atlanta Botanical garden, Pikes or Kroger stores, or from the Show's Ticket Hotline at 404-888-5511. 
