




Security Alert Signs

- Homeowners watering during appropriate times should be doing so on address-based odd-even days

The drought impacts us all, please due your part in helping to conserve water and follow the restrictions.

Save the Date—Symphony in the Park is Back!



Neighbors Who Make a Difference—Lisa Bankoff

As 2001-2002 president of Friends, the volunteer organization of Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, Lisa Bankoff devoted countless hours to helping the patients and families of Children's.

In addition to heading up the 5,000 members of Friends, Lisa is also a wife and mother of two. To balance Friends and family, she recruits her husband and children and turns supporting Children's into a family affair.

Lisa began volunteering after her son, Christopher, was hospitalized at Children's at Egleston in

1981. "The hospital was there when we needed them, so I promised myself that I would always be there when the hospital needed me," Lisa explains. She began working with patients, and soon joined what is now Community Friends in her Brookwood Hills neighborhood.

The rest of Lisa's "résumé" reads like a full-time employee's: Christmas Parade band chair (1991-1992), Parade chair (1993), Festival of Trees chair (1995), Festival of

Lights in Centennial Park co-chair (1996-1998), Art of the Season board member (1999-2000) and gift shop chairperson (2000) and Run for Children's chair (1999-2000).

"Lisa is a special person and one of those rare volunteers that every organization hopes to have on board," said Scott Hodoval, vice president, Development for the Children's Healthcare of Atlanta Foundation. "She has truly poured her heart and soul into every volunteer position she has had at Children's. Her tireless fundraising and volunteer leadership efforts over the years have played a tremendous role in our ability to care for our community's most precious resource-our children."

Lisa's family's involvement is just as important to her. "My children grew up 'volunteering.' When they were little I took them along on all my Projects so they could 'assist' me," she adds. "I believe we should all give back to our community. Seeing my children volunteer gives me hope."

Daughter Margaret, a high school senior, serves as

a Teen Friend. Christopher. a college junior, is a member of Friends Junior Committee, a volunteer group of young professionals, and played Santa at last year's Christmas patient party. Lisa's husband, Joe, an attorney at King and Spalding, is also incredibly supportive. Thanksgiving morning, he woke up bright and early to pick up all the ingredients for a hearty dinner for patients and their families at Children's. The Bankoff family spent their

Thanksgiving cooking, carving and serving.

As for keeping both Friends and family motivated, Lisa says it boils down to gaining from giving. "Volunteering must always be a positive experience. If someone walks away from a patient party or an event with a good feeling, chances are they'll do it again.

Solicitors in Brookwood Hills

Over the last several weeks we have had numerous individuals soliciting in Brookwood Hills. Soliciting is legal, however 99% of the solicitors that knock on your doors are scams. If a solicitor knocks on your door the best thing to do is not to answer it, but if you chose to, then please do the following:

- Ask for organizational identification
- The sellers picture id
- And a city permit!

ATTENTION!

Solicitors that come to your home must have identification that says "City Of Atlanta" (not Fulton county, DeKalb county, unincorporated, etc.) and can only do business between the hours of 9am and 8pm. If they do not provide you with proper identification CALL 911, GIVE A COMPLETE DESCRIPTION, AND DIRECTION OF TRAVEL! Many of these solicitors are very aggressive and very persuasive. People often give them money or buy their product to get them to go away. Do not let them into your home! In addition, do not provide them with any information about your neighbors!

The Atlanta City Code On Solicitation

Sec. 30-597. Hours of solicitation. It shall be unlawful for any person, while conducting the activities of solicitation pursuant to chapter 30, article VII, whether licensed or unlicensed, to enter upon any private property, knock on doors or otherwise disturb persons in their residences between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. on any day

PERMIT Sec. 30-611. Required. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in door to door sales of consumer goods or services in the city without first obtaining a permit from the city. Prior to any solicitation provided for in this article, the person making the solicitation shall, before making any other statement, state the following: (1) The identity of the person making the solicitation; (2) The name and address of the person represented by such person; and (3) The identity or kinds of goods or services being offered for sale. (b) In addition to meeting the requirements set forth in subsection (a) of this section, the person making the solicitation shall show and display identification which states the information required by statement. Such identification shall be on a form approved by the mayor or the mayor's designee.
