
Celebration Spills Out into the Streets

A major water main project designed to improve the delivery of water to Piedmont Hospital is underway, disrupting traffic on Collier Road between Ardmore & Dellwood Drives. Daily through Friday, August 13th, one lane of traffic is being closed between 7:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m., and on Saturdays the lane is also being closed between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.


Water Your Trees!

Especially vulnerable are trees planted within the last two years, as their root systems are not fully developed. Urban trees require an average of fifteen gallons of water a week, with the largest of our trees needing much more. 2010 Swim Team Victorious!

The Bullfrogs leaped to victory by completing the 2010 dual meet season undefeated and were awarded the Dual Meet Champion trophy Saturday, June 26th at Georgia Tech before the Divisional Championship Meet. One of those wins was against Windward, breaking a ten-year losing streak. In his eighth year at the helm, Head Coach Tim Storsteen led the 260-swimmer team to yet another impressive finish when they finished third in the Divisional Championship Meet. Fifty-five of our swimmers went on to compete in the Championship Finals on Sunday where they finished third overall amongst seventy-six teams.

The 13-14 boys had a hand in cementing a record-breaking season as well. James King broke the record for the 50-back. He was joined by Jay Bland, Chas Torres and Carter Watson to break the medley relay record during the dual meet season. Then they went on to break *that* record during the championships.

"It's taken eight years but we now have a solid group of swimmers in each age group," says Coach Tim. "I'm really proud of how well the junior coaching program has worked. All of them have been members and have been promoted from within. They get excited about making a commitment to swimming and having the opportunity to coach here. That's what makes Brookwood Hills a special family place."

That community spirit enabled the kids, with the encouragement of their coaches, to raise almost \$3,000 for Camp Sunshine, a fun place for kids with cancer and their families, during the annual swim-a-thon. 

Feed your pets inside and never leave food outside. Keep garbage containers sealed and tidy. Protect the pets in your yard with a fence five feet or higher to prevent coyote or fox intrusion. If you see a coyote or fox, let it know you're there by clapping, shouting and so on, so that it understands your back yard is your territory.
