- Members who have long-term houseguests (one week or more) should consult with the Pool Manager to purchase a visitor's pass.






Fabulous Festivities for the Fourth (cont.)






Brookwood Hills' David Pless Becomes Two-Time All-American in Shot Put

In March of this year, Bates College sophomore David Pless, son of Dana Halberg and Larry Pless on Palisades, took his first step toward becoming a two-time All-American in shot put for NCAA Division III. At the NCAA Division III Indoor Track and Field Championships, David passed his own school record to take first place, with a top effort of 56 feet, 6 inches. This was David's first NCAA Championship appearance. He then came in 8th in the Outdoor Nationals at Ohio Wesleyan in Delaware, OH in May to clinch his two-time status.

Pless first took up track and field in eighth grade, after getting cut from a baseball team. Enthusiasm for the sport has turned to passion since he arrived at Bates. Pless undertook a strenuous training routine last summer, paying for his own athletic trainer outside of Atlanta for four sessions a week, driving an hour and a half round-trip to get there. He paid for the personal




David Pless at Indoor Track and Field Championships, March 2011

Sidewalk & Curb Repair Update

Launched earlier this year, the sidewalk and curb repair initiative has significant progress to report. Sara Jean Burke, Ramsay Battin, Phil Junger and Jim Moynihan undertook the review of our neighborhood sidewalks and curbs in conjunction with the City of Atlanta as part of the Beautification and Livability Committee's efforts.

Assisted by block captains on each street, the team reviewed the sidewalks and curbs of 54 homes and properties with the City Inspector. Almost all of these were located between Peachtree and Huntington/Wakefield in the older part of the neighborhood.

The City made a determination on those sidewalks that had tree-related damage, which the City would fix at its own expense, and those sidewalks that had suffered from wear and tear, which would be the responsibility of the homeowner to pay for the repair.

As the inspections neared completion, we learned that the City would no longer be providing fee-for-service repair of general wear and tear of sidewalks and curbs. As a result, neighbors needed to submit their payment to the City in advance of June 30th to receive the favorable rates that the city provides—nearly 50% less than it would cost to have a private contractor do the work.

The net result of the activity in May and June was that the City agreed to pay for the repair of 859 linear feet of sidewalks and 509 linear feet of curbs. In addition, 39 homeowners contracted with the City to repair wear and tear damage on an additional 762 linear feet of sidewalks and 1,246 linear feet of curbs — at a cost of \$39,000.

The combined investment of the City and our neighbors would have been nearly \$150,000 if the work had been completed by a private contractor. For a much more reasonable investment, the neighborhood will receive significant benefit:

- 1,600 linear feet of new sidewalks (more than 5 football fields)
- 1,755 linear feet of new curbs (almost 6 football fields)
- 1 out of 6 homes in this "older" part of the neighborhood will have work done on them

Lastly, the Community Club is also taking advantage of the City's favorable rates to repair all of the sidewalks next to the park and pool on Wakefield after the pool closes. It is a great opportunity to enhance what is currently a very torn-up, non-user friendly sidewalk at highly competitive rates.

The wear and tear repair for which neighbors have paid, is required to be completed within 45 days. For tree-related damage, the City has more flexibility on when it completes the projects but we are hoping the City will recognize the value of bundling as many of these BWH projects together as they can.

We can't thank everyone enough who has participated in giving our neighborhood sidewalks and curbs a face lift. Our next step will be to assemble another batch of homes with tree-related damage. We look forward to working with more of our neighbors!
