
A Fabulous Night of Fundraising!




The pool opened on Saturday, May 24th. The weather cooperated, for a change, and the entire weekend was beautiful. The highlight of the weekend was Monday's Memorial Day celebration. We played oldies music. We held games for all ages, including watermelon, T-shirt and parent/child relays, a money dive, big splash contests for children and adults, and the traditional Brookwood Hills "whirlpool". Ryan Marietta, Julia Goode, Elizabeth Bray and Kate Crosby did a great job running the games. Chefs Jeff Walrich and Jed Litsey grilled hamburgers and hotdogs for us after the games.

- Children three (3) years of age and under, and older children, if not potty trained, must wear swim diapers with a lycra swim diaper cover. (We give away the regular swim diapers at the concession stand, if you forget to bring one. We sell the swim diaper covers for \$5.00 each.)

We will have greeters at the front and back entrances to the pool to check in members and guests. Please show the greeter your BWHCC key-chain card, or give the greeter your BWHCC member number or your home address. Should a greeter not be at one of the entrances when you arrive, please write your name in the pool attendance



binder, providing the above information. Please remember to pay your guest fees at the concession stand (\$5.00 per person per day).

If you are planning a poolside party, please contact Jeff Walrich (Pool Manager) at 404-351-0327. It may be necessary to leave a message on the machine, but Jeff will call you back within 24 hours to schedule your party.
