

Membership Renewal Time

It's that time of year to renew your membership in the BWH Community Club. Just think of all we enjoy here by virtue of the club:

Clear Creek Corner

As some may recall, it has been just over a year since the neighborhood ceased wildlife trapping efforts in the Clear Creek Preserve area. Though we've experienced both a record drought and floods, I'm pleased to report the following wildlife sightings in the last quarter, many of them visible from my home on Camden Road:

- Nesting Great Blue Herons
- Nesting Mallard ducks
- · Many Red-tailed Hawks, one in excess of two feet in height
- Kingfishers, Pileated Woodpeckers, and other birds indicative of a healthy wetlands habitat
- Coyotes
- Red Foxes
- Raccoons
- A pair of River Otters
- Many native snake and salamander species

This demonstrates the abundance and diversity of wildlife in our backyards and is rare, given Clear Creek's proximity to densely urban and industrial environments. This surge in wildlife is a direct indication of the health of the Clear Creek watershed. Though the watershed has plenty of room for improvement, the growth in wildlife demonstrates the value of our urban forest as a calm oasis amidst our busy city.

Many of you know Elizabeth Tuthill. She is a special needs adult who moved to Brookwood Hills as a child ten years ago. You may have seen her walking in the street or swimming in the pool. For the ten years she has lived here, I have watched her parents struggle with her future. When everyone else graduates from high school, where will Elizabeth go? Who would take care of her if something were to happen to her parents?

In 2008, Elizabeth's mom and dad and other parents of children with developmental disabilities started Sycamore Ridge as a place that will provide for this "forgotten population." It will be a planned residential community where adults with developmental disabilities can live, learn and thrive, a community that will offer these exceptional adults real homes, real careers, lifelong learning, and personal wellness.

On March 27th at 9:00 a.m., there will be a 5K race in Brookwood Hills to help support the vision of Sycamore Ridge. Approximately one hundred runners are expected, beginning and ending at the pool entrance. All roads in the neighborhood except Brighton Road will be a part of the run. No roads will be closed to traffic, however, so if you are driving in the neighborhood during the run please be extra cautious! All participants should be off the course by 11:30 a.m. Runners, walkers, children, dogs and strollers are welcome! Sycamore Ridge will only become a reality with the support of our community. Tennis Clinics Being Organized for the Summer

Ms. Lee King will once again be conducting Junior Tennis Clinics, Women's Intermediate Tennis Clinics, and Women's Beginning Tennis Clinics on the Brookwood Hills tennis courts.
