

Frank White: A Multi-Dimensional Artist

Neighbor Frank White on Palisades is probably best known as the current Executive Director of the Alabama Historical Commission, a state agency which handles and maintains a large number of historic sites, such as Creek Indian locations, Civil War sites and places of significance to the Civil Rights movement, so these can be preserved and shared with the public.

But if you are ever fortunate enough to enter the house of Cissie and Frank White, you will witness firsthand Frank's true passion. While Frank and Cissie are avid collectors of American Southern folk art, plain style furniture and folk pottery, Frank is also a talented artist in his own right. Their house is adorned with unique pieces from their collection, but most impressive and noticeable are Frank's own three-dimensional creations. These pieces represent combinations of two of Frank's great passions: musical instruments and architecture.

Because Frank's background is in architecture, he explained, he thinks three-dimensionally when he creates.

Frank's pieces begin on an unconventional foundation, or "canvas": he builds his sculptures around birdhouses.

With the birdhouse as the basis for each piece, Frank adds shapes of wood and other materials to create images of musical instruments, evoking elements of cubism, symbolism, folk art and musical lyrics. He then paints the finished pieces, decorating each one according to a theme. Often his work incorporates pieces of wood that have a particular significance. The standing piece, "Frank's Blue Wing Bluebird House," is made from a carved limb salvaged from a neighborhood tree felled during a storm in the early nineties.

Above the fireplace in the White's living room, four pieces are displayed side by side. "Segovia's Special" is reminiscent of Picasso's cubist paintings of instruments. "Frank's Dream Guitar" is a composition of bright colorful shapes, "On the Wings of a Snow White Dove" takes its title from an old African-American spiritual song, and "Blackened Crows".

Pool Improvements


- Installed new filtration tanks in October.


Frank White: A Multi-Dimensional Artist



Frank is devoted to music and to the contributions of some of the great musicians of our time. When legendary musician B. B. King played at Center Stage in 1990, Frank went to see him, bringing his birdhouse sculpture inspired by King, titled "King, B. B." and displaying the letters "B B" back-to-back with a crown on a headstock. The tour manager brought the sculpture backstage to show to King, who invited Frank backstage during intermission, and allowed him to watch the rest of the show from the wings. King then autographed and dated the piece, and it remains one of Frank's most cherished pieces.

Another homage to one of his idols of the music world is Frank's piece, "Hank Williams Will Always be the Greatest," dedicated to country musician Hank Williams who died at the age of 29. Frank also has a personal connection to the band The Black Crowes. Stan Robinson, father of band members Chris and Rich Robinson, is a family friend. Because his son Rich developed an interest in painting, Stan brought Rich to meet Frank and see his work. Frank's piece "Blackened Crows" is inspired by the Black Crowes and their music.

The intense joy that Frank gets out of his own work is evident. When he displayed one of his favorite pieces, "Opry," at a group art show a few years ago, he deliberately asked an exceptionally high price in the secret hope that it wouldn't sell. However, it was quickly bought by an art lover. Frank soon regretted selling the piece, and he convinced the collector to sell the piece back to him, even paying a higher price than the original sales price to be reunited with his work.

Despite Frank's artistic prowess, he is fiercely private about his work. He does not have a web site, has no interest in exhibiting in a gallery, and does not do work by commission. "I can't sell my creativity," he says. "Creativity is a gift, and you can't sell a gift." Frank considers himself very lucky not to have to part with the artwork he loves. "A starving artist has to sell his work, to stay alive. I do not." In addition to his artwork, Frank is a progressive learning guitar player, but in this activity, too, his private nature is revealed. He does not like to play for other people. "Tll sometimes play for my family," he admits, "only because they are very sympathetic and understanding."
