



# Compostwheels: Giving back to our GA Farmers



Last week I met with David Paull, CCO of Compostwheels in Atlanta. I am so excited to join his program which supports urban agriculture.

I learned about compost wheels from Amanda Baxter on Northwood. I met with David Paull at Bright Side Farm which sub-leases a small piece of land from the Berea Menonite Church on Bouldercrest Road. I was interviewing Paull with my Atlanta On the Path partner Leigh Mallis about his compost service. Leigh and I were immediately struck by the necessity, integrity, giving-back and affordability of Compostwheels.

For \$29.95 a month, I will have a weekly pickup of my compost material. For \$20 a month, you can have a pickup every two weeks, ideal if you have less waste than the Lee household.

Compostwheels provides a raccoon-safe bin and allows me to arrange the pick up location from any area at our home. I asked Paull repeatedly if the compost buckets attract unwanted critters and he assured me they have never had a break-in . Not even the midtown rats can get into the organic nirvana.

The compost material is processed and then provided to our local Georgia Farmers at NO COST! I am so happy to take our family's organic waste and have it converted to outstanding soil AND given to farmers who appreciate the soil. In fact, my compost waste will go to the Piedmont Park Conservancy for planting year round.

Why haven't I composted myself? I have dreaded the thought of the worms, maggots, and possible raccoons. I also know it is unlikely I would use all the ripe material once ready, 8 months later. All good intentions but no need for extra responsibilities in the Lee house. I just want David and Graham to clean the garage.

For years I have admired composting but I have not wanted the responsibility of effective composting. Still, I have resented throwing out banana peels, tea bags, broccoli stems and bags of rotten kale into a trash bag for a landfill. I have even paid over \$500 to my plumber to be told that I cannot put the rotten kale down the disposal.

With Compostwheels, I may request up to 75 pounds of compost delivered to our yard a year. This is a win-win for urban agriculture. This means as the consumer, I get to bridge the gap between myself and the farmers who grow the local produce I purchase.

Compostwheels provides my favorite new service for all of us in Brookwood Hills and other urban environments. \$29.95 is probably an amount that can fit into many budgets. Besides, it feels like a double-fisted donation to our environment and our Georgia farmers.

## Peter Pan's in the Neighborhood

Pixie dust, swash-buckling pirates, and a boy who wouldn't grow up. Close the windows to your children's nursery – Neverland is calling!

Ten-year-old Brookwood Hills resident Rachel Doman is one of the many adventurers in Fabrefaction Theatre Conservatory's musical production of Peter Pan playing April 23 through May 10. The show features a cast of Atlanta's top professional actors and 48 student actors in elementary, middle, and high school. Representing our city's most dedicated and extraordinary emerging artists, the student cast is currently immersed in a rigorous 14-week training process to become part of Fabrefaction's professional season. These young artists play Peter, the Darling children, the Lost Boys, and many of the Indians, animals, and other characters that make this well-loved adventure so memorable. They will be joined by seasoned pros, including 2013 Suzi Bass winner Craig Waldrip as Captain Hook and AEA member and Broadway Veteran Pamela Gold Alexander as Mrs. Darling.

The students are double cast in their roles over the three week run, with each scheduled to appear in approximately half of the 16 performances. The 15 elementary school, 18 middle school, and 15 high school students represent 25 Atlanta schools, including Galloway, Lovett, North Atlanta, Pace, Paideia, Sutton, Trinity, and Westminster. Brookwood Hills resident Rachel

Doman is one of three elementary school students from Trinity. Playing Tootles, the littlest Lost Boy, Rachel says, "Where else can I sword fight with pirates? I love performing with my theater friends and learning from the professionals. (Fabrefaction cofounder and director) Christina Hoff makes the experience fun for everyone – and every kid gets a good role."


Fabrefaction Theatre Conservatory (FTC) is located in West Midtown only ten minutes from Brookwood Hills at 999 Brady Avenue, one block west of Howell Mill, at the intersection of 10th street and Brady. Performances run Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays at 8 pm, Saturdays at 2 pm, and Sundays at 3 pm, with a special Industry Night performance on Monday, May 4 at 8 pm. ## Palisades Road Beautification Project
