## Beautification and Livability Committee Launches Sidewalk Repair and Tree Trimming Initiative

The Brookwood Hills Community Club (BWHCC) recently launched two key initiatives to help enhance the beauty of the neighborhood. Spearheaded by the recently-formed Beautification and Livability Committee, these programs provide individual households with access to services negotiated for the entire neighborhood.

#### Tree-Damaged Sidewalk and Curb Repair Program

The first of two sidewalk initiatives is focused on repairing damage to sidewalks and curbs caused by trees located between the sidewalks and curbs. These trees are on City of Atlanta property, and the City communicated to the Board that it is responsible for making the repairs (general wear and tear is the responsibility of the individual homeowners). For



homeowners who were interested in having the BWHCC assist them in getting tree-damaged repair work completed, neighbors were asked to complete a form prior to March 15th. The Committee is now in the process of submitting a neighborhood-wide work order to the Department of Public Works and helping to shepherd the process through the City's bureaucracy to the best of its ability. Later this spring, the Committee will announce another initiative to help neighbors reduce the cost and complexity of repairing sidewalks suffering from general wear and tear.

#### **Tree Pruning Program**



Another area of opportunity is improving the condition of the trees located between sidewalks and curbs. Specifically, the Committee is focused on raising the canopy and reducing the "sucker" limbs on these trees. The intent is to make sidewalks more passable for pedestrians, maintain shade while improving the air flow during the summer months, increase the beauty of the trees, and enhance the overall health

and structure of the trees. The Committee has negotiated a discounted rate program with ArborMedics, a trusted arborist that has worked for many years in the neighborhood. More information can be found at <a href="http://tinyurl.com/4fw9dcf">http://tinyurl.com/4fw9dcf</a>.

## City of Atlanta Granite Curbs Program

In addition to the Beautification and Livability Committee's efforts to repair sidewalks and curbs damaged by trees, Brookwood Hills residents can also chose to replace existing concrete curbs with granite curbs through a City of Atlanta program.

Granite curbs are generally considered more attractive than concrete, have a slightly higher profile to them (e.g. rise higher up out of the street), and last longer than concrete curbs. The City will install granite curbs at a cost of roughly \$38-40 per linear foot, depending on the finish of the granite desired (generally, the \$38 version is what most people install). At this price point, the homeowner is basically paying for the granite and getting the installation for "free".

If you have interest in granite curbs, here is the process:

- Call the Customer Service Request Line for the City of Atlanta Public Works department at 404-330-6333
- Customer Service will then put in a request for a City of Atlanta inspector to come to your home to give you a detailed quote for the curb
- The inspection generally will happen within two (2) weeks of the inspection request
- The inspector will leave a cost quote and authorization form in your mailbox
- You then sign the authorization form and send a check into the City
- The work is supposed to be done within 45 days after the City receives your check

## Support the Beautification Committee

Donations will be used by the Beautification and Livability Committee (BLC) to improve the "public-facing" portions of our neighborhood. The BLC is primarily focused on identifying programs that can be funded by entities other than the BWHCC (e.g. individual homeowners, abutting commercial real estate owners, the City of Atlanta, etc). In certain limited cases, the BLC may use donated funds to the Beautification effort to subsidize or reduce the costs to individual homeowners, especially where financial constraints limit a homeowner's ability to participate in certain beautification projects that benefit the entire neighborhood.

## Eco-Friendly Disposal & Recycling Event in Buckhead

On March 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>, Livable Buckhead, Inc. and Live Thrive, Inc. are teaming up with Atlanta City Council Representatives Howard Shook and Yolanda Adrean to bring Buckhead residents an eco-friendly way to dispose of hazardous waste and other items. Hazardous waste is defined as


a products whose use or disposal poses a threat to human health or the environment through exposure or contamination. Four properties make a product hazardous: it is flammable or combustible, it is explosive or reactive, it is corrosive, or it is toxic.

From 10am until 2pm, experts will be on site at 92 West Paces Ferry Road to collect: old computers and electronics, medications,

unused paint, important documents that need to be shredded, magazines, cardboard, pa-

perback books, printer cartridges, household furnishings less than ten years old, including mattresses, batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, other hazardous household wastes like pesticides and pool chemicals, spent grease and oil.
