#### BWH Park Improvement Plan

On Saturday, March 29th, The Brookwood Hills Park Planning Committee and landscape architecture firm HGOR hosted the second of three visioning meetings for the Brookwood Hills Park master plan. The meeting was held at the Rich Auditorium at Piedmont Hospital and was attended by several dozen BWHCC park members.

Todd Fuller and Jennifer Buchanan of HGOR began the meeting by providing a recap of the initial (February 15<sup>th</sup>) design meeting, which prioritized and confirmed the goals of the five year park plan. Todd and Jennifer also re-capped the ideas of proposed improvements that community members posted to the Park master plan's *Pinterest* page.

Bob Hughes of HGOR walked community members through three proposed master plan concepts, which represented varying levels of development vision for the park master plan.

The lowest- impact master plan concept, titled "The Face Lift" kept park elements in much the same location as they are currently, but made substantial improvements to park connectivity, social spaces, drainage, and facilities management.

The second master plan concept, titled "The Shift", sought to re-locate current park programmatic elements into more ideal function locations. The playground areas were shifted into the southeastern corner of the park, which is an area that currently consists of lawn that is too shady to adequately grow turf, and a basketball court. In this location the playground would benefit from shade, improved layout efficiency, and an increased visual connectivity to the pool area, as well as the opportunity to incorporate the hill into a slide feature. The lawn area was proposed to shift closer to

wards the previous playground location, which is a preferable location in terms of drainage, airflow, and natural sunlight. "The Shift" also proposed major improvements to connectivity, social spaces, and facility management, and in general sought to improve the visual connectivity of the park to the pool.

The highest-impact master plan concept, title "The Ideal Backyard" incorporated all of the improvements delineated in "The Shift", however it also proposed major improvements for social opportunities along the west edge (Parkdale Way) of the park. Proposed improvements included pavilion overlook, outdoor kitchen / grilling area, outdoor fireplace, and stone terrace.

HGOR and community members spent several hours discussing aspects of each of the plans and raised à number of issues / questions that HGOR will explore in refining to a final master plan. Discussions revolved around:

Finding the "right size" for social space (daily use vs. event use)

- Exploring the opportunity for a pavilion overlook in the park corner adjacent to the proposed playground area, and additional improvement of the relationship between pool area and the park
- Ensuring that larger drainage issue is addressed (park flooding resulting from clogged inlets on Parkdale Way)
- Maintenance access / trash service for the pool area (ensuring it doesn't affect adjacent park uses)
- Providing connectivity from the nature trail down to the basketball courts
- Natural Turf vs. Synthetic Turf
- Cost of maintenance / upkeep

HGOR will be assimilating the comments from design meeting #2, and will be revising the concepts into a refined master plan vision. The next design meeting will be held on May 03 at the Rich Auditorium at Piedmont Hospital, from 2:00-4:00 pm.


## Free Fab'rik BWH Young Entrepreneur: Hannah Granot


