

Thanks to all who renewed your membership this year, and to all who proudly displayed your "Member" sign! Many were disappointed when the signs were removed! Many went to great lengths to attach their sign to the stake when it fell offscrews, duck tape, nails, etc. My children enjoyed playing "Find the Sign" as we drove through the neighborhood. While we do not have 100 percent neighborhood participation, I am pleased to announced that upwards of 90 percent of our neighbors do belong to the club. This is an especially good rate, considering it was an "assessment" year. I would also like to give a special thanks to the 31 "B" members who voluntarily contributed to the Capital Improvement Plan, even though they do not use the pool or tennis facilities.

With regard to "C" membership, approximately 66 percent renewed, as compared to an 88 percent renewal rate last year. The departing C members gave a variety of reasons for not renewing. While some C members did not renew because of the assessment, many of them took pains to explain that their children were getting older, so the assessment had merely accelerated by a year or two their decision to let their membership lapse. Other C members did not renew because they were accepted into country clubs or because they were moving out of the area. Overall, the feedback on our renovation program has been overwhelmingly supportive. Forty new "C" member families have already joined the pool and park. I look forward to getting to know them.

VIGILANCE NEEDEDTO PROTECT OUR TREES

On March 31, a crew hired by Bell South came into the neighborhood to prune the limbs of certain trees on upper and middle Camden Road. The crew did not have a permit, as required by the city arborist, and did a great deal of damage to several trees, cutting far more than was necessary to clear the lines. The trees were notably disfigured. Fortunately, before damage was done to even more trees, a few residents of Camden Road approached the crew and asked them to stop. The crew responded to the visible concern of the residents and did all subsequent cutting in a much more careful, professional manner. The neighborhood was spared additional damage thanks to the vigilance of these neighbors.

Many people have put a great deal of time and effort into protecting the tree canopy that adds value, not only to our homes, but to our quality of life in Brookwood Hills. Much of that work can be undone in a matter of minutes by irresponsible or careless workers. Please get involved if you see a utility, city service provider, or private contractor doing work in a manner that unnecessarily compromises our street trees. In addition to careless pruning, watch for any activity that impinges on a tree's sensitive roots, such as trenching with machines into the root system (rather than trenching by hand to avoid, where possible, the roots) or the presence of heavy equipment or materials on a tree's roots. Please note that the roots extend all the way out to the perimeter of the tree's leafy canopy. If you observe something that appears to pose an immediate threat to the trees, please act quickly to communicate your concerns to workers, ask to see a permit from the city arborist and if they don't have one, ask them to stop what they are doing. Please advise them that they will be held accountable for any unnecessary damage done to the trees of Brookwood Hills. Also, please contact me at 404-352-0877 or any other member of the tree committee. If you are unable to reach us, you can call the Director of the Park Bureau, Jay Lowery, directly at 404-817-6744.

On a final note, I recently met with Jay Lowery to conduct a review of the condition of the neighborhood's trees. As a result of this meeting, Jay is submitting work orders to the Parks Department to remove deadwood from sixteen trees, reduce weight from seven trees that are leaning heavily over homes, and check for rot in four trees. Look for them soon.

- With summer comes swim lessons, and we are excited about the swim lesson program this season. Listed below are the dates for the swim lesson sessions:
 - \circ **Session 1:** June 4 15 (Monday Thursday)
 - o Session 2: June 18 29 (Monday Thursday)
 - O Session 3: July 9 20 (Monday Thursday)
- A session of lessons consists of eight (8) one half-hour lessons.
- ☐ The cost for a session of lessons is \$50.00 per student.
- The instructor and participants will mutually decide upon the exact times of the lessons.
- There needs to be a minimum of three (3) students registered for the class in order to hold class, and there will be a maximum of six (6) students allowed per class.
- The classes that are available are outlined below. Please note that availability of these classes is based on the number of interested participants.
 - o Tadpoles For children who are unable to swim ten feet unassisted. Afraid of the water.
 - Primary skills For children who are unable to swim, however, they must be able to put face in water. Introduction to front crawl, front and back float.
 - Stroke Readiness For children who can swim at least 10 feet, and can swim some on their back.
 - Stroke Development For children who can swim freestyle, some backstroke, and some breaststroke.
- ☐ If you are interested in private swim lessons, the cost is \$20 per one half-hour lesson or \$120 for a session of eight (8) one half-hour lessons.
