

Acorn Auction 2002 Raises \$43,000!

On a balmy spring evening in April, approximately 150 Brookwood Hills residents turned out for the Garden Club's biennial Acorn Auction. 
New Members: Everyone Can Join

Park Opening May 25th!

The finishing touches are being completed in time for opening day May 25th. Until that day, please note that the entire BWH Community Club is still a construction site and is closed. With contractors, landscapers and Swim Atlanta scurrying around to prepare for opening day, it creates a potential safety hazard for our children. If there is any chance that we can open areas earlier, we certainly will. It is especially important to keep all pets and humans off the new Tifsport Bermuda sod until it has a chance to take hold. This is the same premium turf that is used by the Redskins, Ravens, Titans and most colleges for their football stadiums as well as used on Golf courses such as TPC Sugerloaf, Atl. Athletic Club and Druid Hills. It is very durable once it is given a chance to root adequately.

A couple other features to note regarding the park and Tennis facilities for BWH Community Club Members:

- There is a bathroom accessible year-round in the park, as well as one for the tennis courts and Pavilion area. These may be accessed by pressing the 3 and 4 keys at the same time on the combination keypad.
- A new youth basketball court has been created on the south side of the park near the pool fence. This was unused space in the past.
- There are two new basketball goals in the area alongside the tennis courts, one adjustable for youth play as well
- A new recreation area has been created alongside the tennis courts adjacent to the basketball court that can be used for roller hockey, four square, shuffle board, skateboarding etc.
- Two year-round chilled drinking fountains have been added in the park, located in the breeze way of the park storage-shed and Bathroom.
- Additional seating has been added thanks to several club members who have pitched in \$1000 to donate beautiful Teak Benches (we still need more if you or your group are interested).
- Tetherball has come to BWH. If you are not familiar with this sport, come check it out, located next to the climbing boulder.
- A new covered grill was added to the park pavilion.
- Pet waste bag dispensers have been added at the entrances to the park and nature trail for use in the park and around the neighborhood.

- 5.) Continuing support of the Big Apple Circus Clown Care Unit.
- 6.) Funding of Bone Marrow Transplantation and the Sickle Cell program at the AFLAC Cancer Center and Blood Disorders Service.

The hospital would not be able to fund these programs without the city-wide Friends' groups.

Guidelines for Watering Trees

Despite the recent heavy rains, as summer temperatures rise and dry conditions return, all of our trees will suffer and many will not survive without regular watering. Please read the following guidelines and, if possible, try to schedule a regular time(s) each week for watering your trees.


Recommendations for Young Trees (planted within the last 18 months):


- Water with a slow trickle from your garden hose for 20 to 30 minutes once or twice a week if there has been no substantial rainfall in that week.
- To avoid under or over-watering, please consider purchasing a moisture meter from Pikes or Home Depot and water when the meter registers on the dry side of moist (neither wet nor dry). In the heat of summer, check your moisture levels 3 times per week...
- Be sure your tree is properly mulched and apply the water over the root ball and the entire planting area.
- To minimize the amount of time spent watering your trees, you may purchase a tree gator, which is easy to install around the base of your tree, provides a continuous slow drip, and only needs to be filled once a week to give your tree adequate water. Gunn Landscaping has agreed to provide these to the neighborhood at cost (\$19.00 per gator). If you wish to purchase one or more tree gators for any recently planted trees up to 4 inches dbh (diameter at breast height), please contact Nancy Field at (404) 352-0877.
- Please make arrangements for your young trees to be watered whenever you are out of town.

Recommendations for Older, Established Trees

- If there has been no substantial rainfall in a given week, provide one or two deep soakings to the soil areas that exist directly beneath the foliage of the tree. The location of the tree's canopy mirrors the location of the critical root systems. Where street trees are concerned, some of those roots are beneath concrete and can not be reached. However, when a tree's canopy of leaves extends out in part over a lawn or other landscape areas, this indicates the presence of critical roots directly beneath and a deep soaking in those areas will reach and benefit the tree. Be sure that the water soaks in well. Do not water closer than 3 feet to the trunk base on established trees, and try not to wet the tree's foliage (or trunk). Note: a few deep soakings are much better than many light, shallow watering as the latter promotes shallow root growth which can lead to more severe drought damage.
- The best time to water trees is between 10 pm and 8am, or in the late afternoon.
