



# **Brookwood Hills Wins Award**



The Brookwood Hills Pool/Park Renovation Project will receive an Urban Design Award from the Atlanta Urban Design Commission on May 20th. The presentation will be made by Mayor Shirley Franklin at the 26th Annual Awards of Excellence Ceremony. This honor will be shared by everyone involved in the project, the architects John and Vivian Bencich, our contractor Joe Noah, our construction managers Silverman Construction, and of course by the entire Brookwood Hills Community Club.

Our project just missed the deadline for submission last year since we were not quite complete, but our architects prepared the necessary documentation for this year. We were notified at the end of April that our renovation was one of the projects chosen to receive an award this year. The ceremony is usually covered in the Atlanta Journal Constitution. So look for more information about our park and pool and the impressive company we are keeping in the newspaper.

This is an award that the entire neighborhood and community club can take great pride in. Since so many people contributed so much to the project we are looking for an appropriate way to display the certificate in the pool pavilion. Watch for it this summer.

#### **Make Your Park Reservations Now**



## **Brookwood Hills Family Starts Autism Program**

Brookwood Hills is blessed with many amazing families and even more exceptional children. It is no surprise then to find one of our own Brookwood Hills families creating a program to enhance the lives of children with special needs. Kim and Allen Tuthill have established Play For Tomorrow, Inc., a nonprofit program addressing the growing needs of Autistic children in Atlanta. From their own experience with Elizabeth, Kim and Allen are keenly aware of the void that exists for these children in this community.

Play for Tomorrow addresses the needs of children with Autism and other developmental disabilities. This program strives to teach the language, life, and social skills that each child needs for the future by combining Applied Behavior Analysis, Natural Environment Teaching and appropriate social interaction with "typically" functioning peers. "Typically functioning peers" are defined as children ranging in age from six to sixteen that are interested in developing special relationships with peers who face more challenges in their daily lives then most of us could ever imagine.

When the Tuthills moved to Atlanta four years ago, Kim began her search for programs for Elizabeth. Unfortunately, she found very little to help her address the needs of her daughter. Instead of settling for something less, Kim took it upon herself to not only help her own daughter, but she has established a program that will benefit children with and without special needs for generations to come. 
