

The U.S. takes six men and six women to represent the United States and Kelly's fifth place finish earned her a spot on the team. The World Championships are the second Olympic team qualifying race.





What is it with water?

I know I should love water. Most of our bodies are composed of water. It covers three quarters of the Earth's surface. It's pretty darn refreshing on a hot day.

But I keep having problems with water. Have for a long time. Right after we got married we bought a car from a friend. It was a great car but it had one major problem. It leaked every time it rained. When you took off or stopped, it sloshed. Our first house was basically walls with a colander for a roof. The chimney was an indoor waterfall. The chandelier became an aquarium. At our current house it was the opposite. Until we put in new pipes to the upstairs you couldn't fill the tub. (Note to anyone who might buy our house in the future, as I said, that problem has been fixed.)

And where would you expect the fewest problems with water? I would have thought it would be at a pool. Pools are made to hold water. Lots of water. That's their sole purpose in life. Everything about them is built for water. They're a water wonderland.

But one of our greatest fears at the pool this summer is water. Water from rainstorms that drop too much water in too short of a time. The drains in the neighborhood can handle only so much. And if they clog up with debris we're really in trouble.

Last year we had 20 year rains twice. I guess they didn't know they were twenty years too soon. So the Board had a study done to determine where we had problems and what could be done about them. The biggest issue is storm drains. We don't have enough. We've begun lobbying the city government but with this economic climate at City Hall that is expected to take a while. But there were measures we could take immediately. And we are.

The park itself is our first line of defense from flash floods. Unfortunately last summer it simply channeled that water to the pool. It was determined that we need to slow the water, redirect it and channel it away within the park. Construction has begun. It includes additional drains. Larger drains. Rock buffers to slow the flow. And a wall to act as a final barrier.

Scott Bass, Benning Grice, Mark Potts and others have led this effort. And we have high hopes for its success. Surely a 20 year rain won't happen again for the third time in two years. But if it does we've taken steps to stop it. No one wants a little water to get in the way of a good time at the pool.

Of course I don't have such a good track record with water.


Thanks to all the generous Brookwood Hills neighbors who helped us with our games drive for the Atlanta Youth Academy.
