

# **Buckhead Council of Neighborhoods**

Recently, Brookwood Hills became a paying member of The Buckhead Council of Neighborhoods (Council). In 2008, the Council was created to bring Buckhead neighborhoods together to "address and protect the common interests and quality of life issues shared by all of the individual Buckhead neighborhoods." Each neighborhood is represented on the Council by a representative. Brookwood Hills is represented by Matt Tolleson (Vice-President) and Amanda Baxter (Clear Creek/Government Relations Chair).

According to Council Chairman and Chastain Park Civic Association President, Jim King, "The formation of this group is long overdue and clearly makes sense for Buckhead. Currently, Buckhead has 43 different neighborhoods recognized by the city. Each of our neighborhoods is focused on its individual concerns



and does not have an effective vehicle for making a lot of headway on larger Buckhead-wide issues. We now have an independent forum for homeowners to share common concerns and propose solutions for community betterment. The Council will empower our neighborhoods to address matters in a more unified and influential manner that will get positive results."

Recently, The Buckhead Council of Neighborhoods has been addressing such issues as a possible new charter elementary school, widespread graffiti tagging, and transportation issues along the major Buckhead corridors. Monthly meetings take place on the SecondThursday at Peachtree Presbyterian Church and are open to Buckhead residents who wish to attend; however, voting is reserved for individual neighborhood representatives.




# **Buckhead Resident Completes Ironman for a Cause**

As he crossed the finish line of the ultimate test of human endurance Oct. 8, Buckhead's Anton Mertens heard the words from the announcer, "You're an Ironman." It's a moment he said he won't forget and is shared with only a select number of athletes from around the world who have completed the Ironman World Championship in Kailua-Kona, Hawaii.

Mertens won a lottery to gain entry into the race, just one of 200 people in the world to make it in that fashion out of an unknown number of applicants, and decided he would use the opportunity to promote the battle against cancer, with which he has a personal connection. His father Herman died of colon cancer in 1993, and Mertens decided he would help raise money through the American Cancer Society through its "Determination" campaign.

Thus far, he has raised more than \$7,000 and hopes to reach \$50,000 by the end of the year. "He wanted to use that platform for something bigger, to help other people, so he decided that the American Cancer Society would be a perfect thing for him because of his family history," Margaret Mertens said. "The sad thing is his father died of a preventable cancer, so if only he had been treated earlier, he may still be with us. So that's important to Anton to raise money for the American Cancer Society and bring about that awareness of being tested."

Margaret Mertens, an experienced triathlete herself who hopes to complete the one in Kona some day, said the atmosphere was electric. "It was much more exciting than I ever imagined it would be, and I wasn't even in it," she said. "I was just there to be a part of Anton's race. It was just amazing, the feeling of just being so excited not only for Anton but for each athlete that crossed."
