
Palisades Volunteer Day


















Tuning for Type1



This year Brookwood Hills has added to our neighborhood's Halloween fun through the addition of a new program benefiting Children's Healthcare of Atlanta ("CHOA"). The CHOA Friends group of Brookwood Hills launched the "Buddy Boo" program fundraiser with great success!

In case you missed it - the program was simple and fun for the whole family Neighbors purchased "Buddy Boo" yard signs and used them to "boo" another neighbor or friend. A "boo" consists of secretly placing a yard sign in a front yard (a trick) and leaving a treat for the recipient. Additionally, for every Boo purchased, a patient at CHOA received a "Buddy Boo" sign for their hospital door and a "Buddy Boo" coloring page. Look around and you'll spot orange and black "Boos" in yards across Brookwood Hills!

This fall, Brookwood Hills neighbors purchased over 240 "Buddy Boo" yard signs - crushing our first year goal to sell at least 100! Our neighborhood has raised almost \$5,000 for the hospital. City-wide this program is expected to raise \$100,000, which is equivalent to a new emergency transport vehicle (ambulance with child-sized equipment) or a salary for an additional psychologist at the Stephanie V. Blank Center for Safe & Healthy Children at Hughes Spalding Hospital.

As a not-for-profit organization, CHOA depends on the generosity of the community to continue to help provide specialized, high-quality medical care and unique services to children and their families. Thank you for supporting Brookwood Hills Friends & CHOA.









