Metropolis Granted Liquor License

Efforts have been made on several fronts to oppose the granting of a liquor license for 1923 Peachtree Road. Formerly the location of Zazu's and more recently called Cafe Reggio, the operator of this property is now trying to open as Metropolis.

On October 6th the neighborhood met with disappointment as the License Review Board recommended approval of the liquor license application of Courtney Dillard, the current owner of Metropolis. At the hearing, the neighborhood expressed its long-standing opposition to a nightclub along this portion of Peachtree Road. Nightclubs and bars feature live entertainment for a late night/early morning clientele. Locating such a business without adequate on site parking, adjacent to a quiet family neighborhood, is totally inconsistent with sound urban planning.

Subsequent to the License Review Board ruling, the neighborhood wrote and called Mayor Maynard Jackson. In our letter, we requested the Mayor meet with representatives of Brookwood Hills and the Ardmore/28th Street neighborhood association prior to taking an action on the pending application. As outlined in our letter, we wished to discuss the reasons we believe this liquor license should not be granted, and to discuss our neighborhood's work to perform a Small Area Study of this portion of Peachtree Road in order to develop long-term solutions to our parking and zoning problems. Regretfully, the Mayor approved the application without first meeting with us.

The neighborhood, Ardmore/28th Street Civic Association and certain nearby neighbors are now in the process of filing a suit to have the liquor license for Metropolis declared illegal and void. In July, a similar suit was filed by Brookwood Hills and these other same parties. On the day of the hearing before Judge Frank Hull, the applicant surrendered his license. Thereafter, he submitted a new application which resulted in the License Review Board hearing on October 6th.

The Board and I am grateful for the efforts of many residents who have assisted us in this struggle. Two former Presidents of the Community Club, Nolan Leake and Bill Withrow, have been particularly helpful and given tirelessly of their time. Two current Board members, Mac Irvin and Pat Leake, have also provided valuable leadership. If you get a chance, please thank them for their efforts.

In addition to volunteer assistance, your Board has spent approximately \$15,000 in legal fees on this issue. This comes at a time when the Community Club faces other fiscal challenges, which you will be hearing more about in upcoming editions of <u>Brooknotes</u>.

We will keep you up to date on further developments in this matter as they occur.


