
From the Editor



Expect to see crews from the City of Atlanta in the neighborhood during the next several weeks. They are responding to work requests from individual residents and the Tree Committee. Darryl Southall, an experienced and knowledgeable City employee, is onsite and responsible for the work. We are in good hands with Mr. Southall. Work requested by the Tree Committee includes removal of large deadwood and pruning to correct storm damage.

In June, several trees were identified by the City Arborist, Frank Mobley, as dead or dying. Out of a concern for safety, those trees have been scheduled to be removed. The homeowners involved have been consulted and are in full agreement with the City's findings.

We all consider the street trees in front of our individual homes as our own. This is the proper attitude. We are the guardians of these trees, responsible for fertilizing, watering, and general care. We are fortunate to have the City help us with the really expensive job of dangerous pruning and removal. Look up at your tree and note its general health. Are you doing all you can?

BUILDING VARIANCES EXPLAINED IN ENGLISH

Renovation has always been a thriving business in Brookwood Hills. Whether a long time resident or a new neighbor, homeowners continue to have questions regarding the procedure required by the City of Atlanta for obtaining building permits and in some instances a variance.

To obtain a building permit, construction plans must be submitted to the Bureau of Building Permits. When found to be in violation of the Zoning Ordinance, the homeowner will receive a referral certificate outlining the specific infraction and whether a variance or special exception is required. The homeowner must then obtain the appropriate application form from the Bureau of Planning. Each application must contain the following: a completed form, the legal description or recent plat of survey, a detailed site plan to scale, a written justification, and the appropriate application fee.

The information regarding our designated NPU (Neighborhood Planning Unit) will be given to the homeowner when the application is submitted to the City. The NPU, which is a citizen advisory group, will make a recommendation to the Board of Zoning Adjustment on the application. At the NPU meeting, comments will be received from the representatives of each neighborhood group including Broowood Hills. Therefore, prior to attending the NPU meeting, the homeowner should present their application in continued on page 5




person to the Brookwood Hills Board of Directors at their regularly scheduled monthly meeting. It is important that the homeowner or their representative be present at the NPU meetingl to present the application and answer any questions from members of the NPU.

Following the NPU meeting, the Board of Zoning Adjustment will decide to approve or to deny the application. The Board of Zoning Adjustment is comprised of a five member board of citizens appointed by the City Council. If the application is approved, the homeowner may obtain a building permit. If denied, the homeowner must adhere to the existing regulations on the property or appeal to the Fulton County Superior Court within 30 days of the decison.

Any specific questions regarding the procedure for obtaining building variances or special exceptions should be addressed to the Bureau of Planning at 404-330-6145. Happy Renovating!
