

A Brookwood Hills Summer Crashes to an End



Yard Trimming Collection for Brookwood Hills

- Is on the 2nd and 4th week of each month. The next pick-up week will be the week of September 27. The city will not guarantee any specific day during the week so you will need to put yard trash out on Monday.
- Please do not put yard bags, cans, limbs or other debris on top of storm-water grates. If possible, please do not put your trash out until the week pick-up is scheduled.
- Any yard waste generated by a landscaping crew should be hauled away by the landscaper and not left for the city.
- If you have a storm-water inlet/grate on the street in front of your house, please make every effort possible to keep this area clean. Leaves and debris tend to accumulate in these areas and clog the drains when there is heavy rain. The city is supposed to clean these but that is not always the case. If we could police these as a neighborhood it would be a big help.


Clean Up After Your Pet

Brooknotes has received numerous requests recently to remind our pet owning neighbors that it is the law to remove any feces left behind by a dog on any sidewalk, gutter, street, lot or any public area. BROOKWOOD HILLS PARTNERING WITH TREES ATLANTA

On the night of the 16th September we saw another example of why we need to quickly address the status of the trees in our neighborhood. Though a storm of the caliber of Ivan would surely have affected us under any circumstance, the age of the trees in Brookwood Hills makes us more vulnerable to any kind of weather. As most of you probably know, many of the trees in our neighborhood were planted when the neighborhood was originally laid out, about 80 years ago, this, coincidentally, is the lifespan of most of these large oaks.

Over the years the Brookwood Hills Garden Club has made a concerted effort to try and replace and replant trees when and where possible. Their efforts must be recognized and commended by all of us. In the last year due to Georgia Power's efforts to remove trees which are hazardous to the power lines and the natural falling of trees around our streets means that we need more than just one group involved with this effort. As a result of this and the efforts of Eve Goldstein we have contacted Trees Atlanta to start a replanting program which we plan to initiate this year and continue over the next few years.

Fall Tree Planting: Saturday, November 6, 2004

As some probably know, the neighborhood's tree canopy is diminishing year after year. The old trees that have graced our streets for the past 80 years are near the end of their life cycle and need to be replaced. Our neighborhood has been planting trees alone for the past few years, but we have decided to partner with Trees Atlanta to plant more trees this coming fall.

Our primary focus for this planting is the right-of-way area between the sidewalk and the street but we are also looking to plant trees in private front yards. Trees planted in the front yards have more room to grow and are free from the constraints of power lines.


The trees in the right-of-way area will provide our sidewalks and streets with shade and the aesthetic look that has been so common to our neighborhood for years.

Want a tree for you front yard? We have sent out individual fliers to all those homeowners who have room to plant in their right-of-way. BUT, you can also receive a tree for your front yard during this same planting.

Here's how it works. A week or two before the planting, an arborist from Trees Atlanta will come to talk to you about your yard and what kind of tree would fit in with your landscaping. You will have the choice between a 10 gallon or 25 gallon tree. The price for a 25 gallon tree is \$35. The 10 gallon trees are free. That's right.....FREE, but as a non-profit organization, Trees Atlanta is asking for donations.

If you are interested in receiving a tree, you will need to contact one of the following: Andrew Whitney (404 350-9614), Katrina Newton (404 355-6574), or Eve Goldstein (404 873-2139).

Whether or not you are receiving a tree, you can still help out. The trees will be planted on Saturday morning, November 6. Volunteers from Trees Atlanta will be working under the guidance of the Trees Atlanta arborist, but we need more help.
