#### Help Restore our Neighborhood Legacy

It is Brookwood Hills Annual Tree Planting time again. To restore our diminishing trademark canopy we need to continue our annual neighborhood plantings.

To regenerate the Brookwood Hills "urban forest", we must plant and nurture more large canopy trees, such as oaks and maples. This has become increasingly important as we have lost almost all of our prized street trees over the last few years. For neighbors living on the power line side of the street, such trees need to be planted in our front yards (not directly under the power lines); those living on the non-power line side of the street may choose to plant these larger trees either in your front yards or at street level.

The following is what you can do to assist:

- Join your friends and neighbors and participate in the upcoming November 5<sup>th</sup> neighborhood tree planting see details below.
- Purchase and plant an oak or maple tree in your front or back yard (see details on how to purchase these below).

<u>WHEN</u>: Saturday, November 5th - 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. (but please come and work for any amount of time that you can commit).

WHERE: We'll meet in the Pavilion at the Brookwood Hills Park for an al fresco breakfast.

<u>WHO</u>: Anyone can help. The work is not overly strenuous and there will be experienced Trees Atlanta staff and volunteers to assist us. What better way to emphasize the importance of our trees than by volunteering to plant them? Planting is appropriate for the entire family. The more volunteers we'll have, the quicker we'll finish. In addition, you may not be aware that many volunteers from outside our neighborhood come and plant trees in Brookwood Hills. Finally, this is a great way for our teenagers and scouts to get service hours! Let's show our gratitude by turning out in force and demonstrating our commitment to our neighborhood replanting program. Please send Boyd Gentry an email if you plan to volunteer so we can get a

good count for breakfast and tree planting purposes.

If you would like to plant a tree in your front yard or at the street, you may choose a tree from a list of "site appropriate" trees that are better adapted to urban conditions and will cause fewer problems than the water oaks that were planted many years ago. Trees Atlanta will provide fifteen-gallon (or smaller) trees for \$25; larger trees (e.g., 25 gallon) will be available at a cost of \$50 per tree. These costs include planting by volunteers, are subsidized by the neighborhood and are significantly below the price you could expect to pay a commercial nursery. Trees Atlanta is also offering the opportunity to purchase trees for your backyard, but the cost for such trees will be slightly higher (approximately \$75 on average), and you will be responsible for planting such trees yourself.

<u>DONATIONS</u>: All donations are welcomed, especially if you cannot actively participate in the planting. Donations made in memory or honor of individuals will be published in BrookNotes.


