Beautification of Palisades and Huntington Entrances

As most of you have likely noticed, we are beginning to do some work relative to the beautification of the Palisades Road entrance islands. We wanted to give everyone a high level snapshot of our plans for this space as well as for the Huntington Road entrance. This work ultimately will be financed primarily through the Garden Club which has spent countless hours over the years raising funds for this project from neighbors and many others.

Palisades Entrances

Over the next several months, we expect to see significant progress in the implementation of a landscape design plan that neighbors Esther Stokes and Stan Dixon first

The Park Needs Your Help!

We all know the story - the floods, the deteriorated infrastructure and related eyesores, the equipment on its last legs. That these characterize one of our biggest assets is incongruous with how most of us probably think about the overall state of our neighborhood and community. There is no question we need to take action not just to fix what's broken, but to enhance one of our most valuable spaces. With your input over the past 2 years, we have a plan that would stop the flooding, address all critical infrastructure needs (stairs, trash & storage, lighting, electrical), replace all equipment, and triple the size of social spaces. It's time to make the park what it should be - a centerpiece of our community.

While all may seem quiet on the park project front, we have been keeping things moving behind the scenes over the past few months. In April we asked for volunteers for a Park Steering Committee and the response was overwhelming - (big thanks to all who responded!), proving again there is a huge amount of energy around this project. Our Committee - Mitch Wickland, Tom Rhodes, Sean Fitzsimmons, and Alison Caughman - has been extremely valuable in providing guidance and input on strategy and planning, helping the Board shape a thoughtful plan that we have been working against. Over the past couple months this has included seeking insight from neighbors on past projects, speaking with other community clubs about their major capital projects and processes, working with our architect (HGOR) to refine elements of our park plan, and developing financial scenarios. Over the next month or so we plan to start turning outward more - sharing a more complete picture of what we plan to do, and how we plan to do it in a series of informal gatherings around the neighborhood. In this effort we will need more of your help, so if you volunteered earlier you aren't off the hook yet! Stay tuned.




CHOA Friends Corner

presented back in 2007. For financial and logistical reasons, we have divided this plan into two main phases:

Phase I: Beautification of the Existing Palisades Islands

The key elements of Phase I include:

- Installation of granite curbs on all three islands
- Installation of granite cobble bands inside the granite curbs similar to Brighton Road entrance
- Removal of the existing bricks and stonework in each of the islands
- Planting of two new Princeton elm trees on the middle island
- Planting of jasmine ground cover on all 3 islands (similar to Brighton Road entrance)
- Shrinking of the island closest to Peachtree so that the cross walk is unimpeded by the island
- Re-siting of historical stone marker on the first island back further into the neighborhood

As folks have seen, we have already kicked off elements of Phase I. At this point, we have spent approximately \$14,500 which will ultimately result in the removal of the existing bricks/stones, demolition of the concrete curbs and installation of granite curbs, shrinking of the first island, removal of the magnolia trees and the re-siting of the stone marker. The \$14,500 cost was financed primarily through a \$6,050 contribution from the BWH Community Club, a \$1,600 contribution from the BWH Garden Club, and \$6,850 of donations from various interested stakeholders (more on that below). We expect Phase I to be completed by the end of 2016 or early 2017.


Phase II: Creation of New Palisades Entrance Elements


The key elements of Phase II include:


- The creation of a new island on Palisades close to the Montclair intersection. This island will have an entrance column similar to Brighton Road that reads "Brookwood Hills". Please note that in the original drawing by Stan Dixon, there are also 2 side piers which we no longer plan to include.
- The installation of inlaid cobblestone pavers across the width of the road with the new island situated at the mid-point of these pavers.

Phase II work is subject to (a) getting the City to sign-off on the creation of a new island (not a given) and (b) finding enough money to execute on these elements (more on that below).

Beautification of Entrances Continued

Neighbors on the Palisades Beautification Committee

The Palisades Road beautification committee first met last summer to discuss this project. Members of the committee include Bonnie Burgess, Sabina Carr, Leslie Carroll, Shannon Cox, Larre Holladay, Bert and Jane Hunecke, Kevin Kleinhelter, Matt Little, Mary Long, Elaine and Jerry Luxemburger, Laura Moser, Caroline Tolleson, and Marty and Brad Whitcomb. Members of this committee who live closest to the proposed new island have also spent considerable time thinking through the exact placement of this island to ensure adequate ingress and egress to their properties.

Donations to Palisades Project

To date, we have raised \$8,450 in cash donations for the Palisades project from the following:

The Brookwood Hills Garden Club, \$1,600

Carroll & Weiss, LLP, \$1,000 (Camden Road neighbor Jamie Carroll is a name partner)

Palisades/Peachtree office building, \$5,000 (Jamie Carroll, whose office is in the building, was instrumental in securing this donation)

Trillium Properties, \$500 (owner of the Lusca/Intermezzo property)

Daughters of the American Revolution, \$350 (the DAR donated the historical marker many years ago)

As noted at the start of this article, the Palisades and Huntington projects will ultimately be financed primarily through donations from the Brookwood Hills Garden Club. The Club has already made available an additional \$14,600 for the completion of the Palisades project – these funds were raised from neighbors at one of the Garden Club fundraisers several years ago (the "Fund-A-Need" fundraiser). More on these generous neighbors in a future article! Finally, with some help and prodding from neighbor Lindsey Potts (Huntington Rd.), Gunnison Tree has donated in-kind services of approximately \$750. If you see Jamie and Leslie Carroll, Lindsey Potts or members of the Garden Club, please thank them for their generosity and please remember Gunnison Tree service for any tree services you may need (404-386-3333). As mentioned above, the BWHCC has already committed \$6,050 to Phase I and has budgeted significantly more to help bring the Palisades project to fruition.

Huntington Road Entrance

Neighbors may recall several years ago that Pruitt Health purchased the Joel & Associates office building on the corner of Peachtree and Huntington. Pruitt presented a plan to the neighborhood to demolish that building and in its place build a new facility that would serve patients recently discharged from the hospital. Brookwood Hills made a condition to our approval of that plan that Pruitt pay for the installation of a Huntington Road entrance beautification plan. That plan includes the placement of cobble pavers across the street as well as two entrance markers on either side of the road.

We were recently informed by Pruitt that they have delayed the demolition of that building for several years and will, until then, use the current building as a back office facility. We have made a formal request to Pruitt to go ahead and fund the Huntington Road entrance plan and are awaiting word back from them as to whether they would do this so far in advance of the demolition of the existing building (contractually, the payment for the entrance plan was tied to the actual demolition of the building).

If we are able to secure these funds from Pruitt for the Huntington entrance, that should position the neighborhood to completely fund Phase II of the Palisades project (e.g. the new island and pavers in the street) as a portion of the funds that the BWHCC and Garden Club have reserved for Huntington could be re-allocated to Palisades.

Conclusion

I'll conclude this long-winded missive by asking folks to please bear with us on the Palisades Road beautification project. We know things look anything but "beautiful" right now! Candidly, we are picking up pennies and nickels wherever we can to fund this project, and are at times having to trade speed for lower costs. We are doing everything thing we can, though, to ultimately maintain the same level of quality as the Brighton Road entrance. 


BWH Bullfrog Swimteam


